New Mormon Elder For Thornhill Area
 Elder Kenneth Rasmussen of Salt Lake City, Utah, has recently moved to the Thornhill area as a missionary with the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormon).
 For the past two months, he has been serving as a missionary in Kitchener. He will now work with Elder Richard Price, who is the district leader, overseeing missionary work for the Newmarket, Richmond Hill and Willowdale area.
 Both men will represent the Mormon church for a period of two years in Ontario, after which they will return home to resume their studies at university for their future vocations.

Golf Course Acquired By Conservationists
 Metro Conservation Authority has officially purchased the 160-acre York Downs Golf Course at the southeast corner of Bathurst Street and Sheppard Avenue for development for public recreation purposes.
 Purchase of the prime parkland area was made under the Authority's 1962 master plan to acquire flood plain and conservation land in the area under its jurisdiction.
 Cost of the property, which comprises about 160 acres, of which 65 are flood plain and conservation lands, was \$9.25 million. The Authority's share—\$5.5 million—was borne by Metro Toronto and North York. The remaining \$3.75 million was contributed by the provincial government.
 The Authority has already acquired lands to the north and south of its recent purchase, and has constructed flood control channels on the west branch of the Don River up stream and down stream of the property. At present, it is building the high Finch Dam and reservoir about five miles up stream of the area.
 The property will be officially taken over by the Authority in October. Metro will be allowed to sublease about 20 acres of the property to North York for development as a local park, but all plans for development will have to be approved by the Authority.

Water & Sewage Facilities Coming

 Stage 3 (1980-85), to cost \$10,550,000, will complete the water supply system for Central York and extend it to the Town of Ajax. It will also provide additional facilities for North Pickering.
 Stage 4 (1985-94) will complete the servicing of North Pickering and the phasing out of water purification plants at Pickering and Ajax at a cost of \$5,000,000.

COST \$90 MILLION
 Total cost of the sewage works during the 22 years covered by the report is \$90,365,000 and waterworks \$37,490,000, based on current estimates — but may escalate if construction costs continue to spiral.
 The report is based on population figures set by the Toronto Centred Plan for Development.
 The ultimate (by 2000) population for Richmond Hill still appears at 67,000, the only difference being that a separate figure of 5,000 has been allowed for Oak Ridges. Present population of Richmond Hill is listed at 29,000 and of the Oak Ridges area as 4,700.
 Maple's present population is given as 1,200 with the ultimate to be 5,000. Woodbridge's present population of 2,500 will be allowed to grow to 20,000.

THORNHILL EXPLOSION
 The North Fringe area (including Thornhill) with a present population of 16,000 will grow to 95,000 and the Markham-Unionville area with 10,000 people now will go to 21,000.
 The North Pickering area (the new airport town) would have a population of 7,500 by 1990, 25,000 by 1995, 70,000 by 1990, 125,000 by 1995 and 200,000 ultimately. Ajax now at 12,000 will reach 40,000 and Pickering will double its present 2,500 population.

NEWMARKET AND AURORA, NOW
 lumped at 29,000, will have an eventual population of 50,000 and Southwest Pickering now at 23,000 will grow to 115,000. Total ultimate population for the area of the study will be 623,000 (present population is 128,900) about evenly divided between Central York and Pickering.

PROVINCE TO PAY
 The Province of Ontario will provide 15% of the gross capital cost of stages 1 and 2, the rest of the cost (including interest) will be paid for by the municipalities involved, but the systems will remain the property of the province and under its control.
 The proposed rate (including operating expenses) is 65¢ per 1,000 gallons for sewage service. Present cost in Richmond Hill is 14.5¢ per 1,000 gallons.
 The proposed rate for water service is 31¢ per 1,000 gallons plus whatever Metro charges for providing the water, which may well double or triple that cost.

SOLUTION TO PROBLEMS
 The financial proposals are on the basis of full participation by all municipalities for both water and sewage services. The rates quoted are based on full participation with expected population projections realized.
 The report claims that these undertakings will materially reduce major sources of pollution in urban watercourses; direct growth and development as intended in the Toronto-Centred Region concept both north and east of Metro; materially reduce the pressures on Metro for housing; facilitate the servicing of the new airport complex; and finally, as originally intended, resolve the difficult servicing problems in the Central York area.
