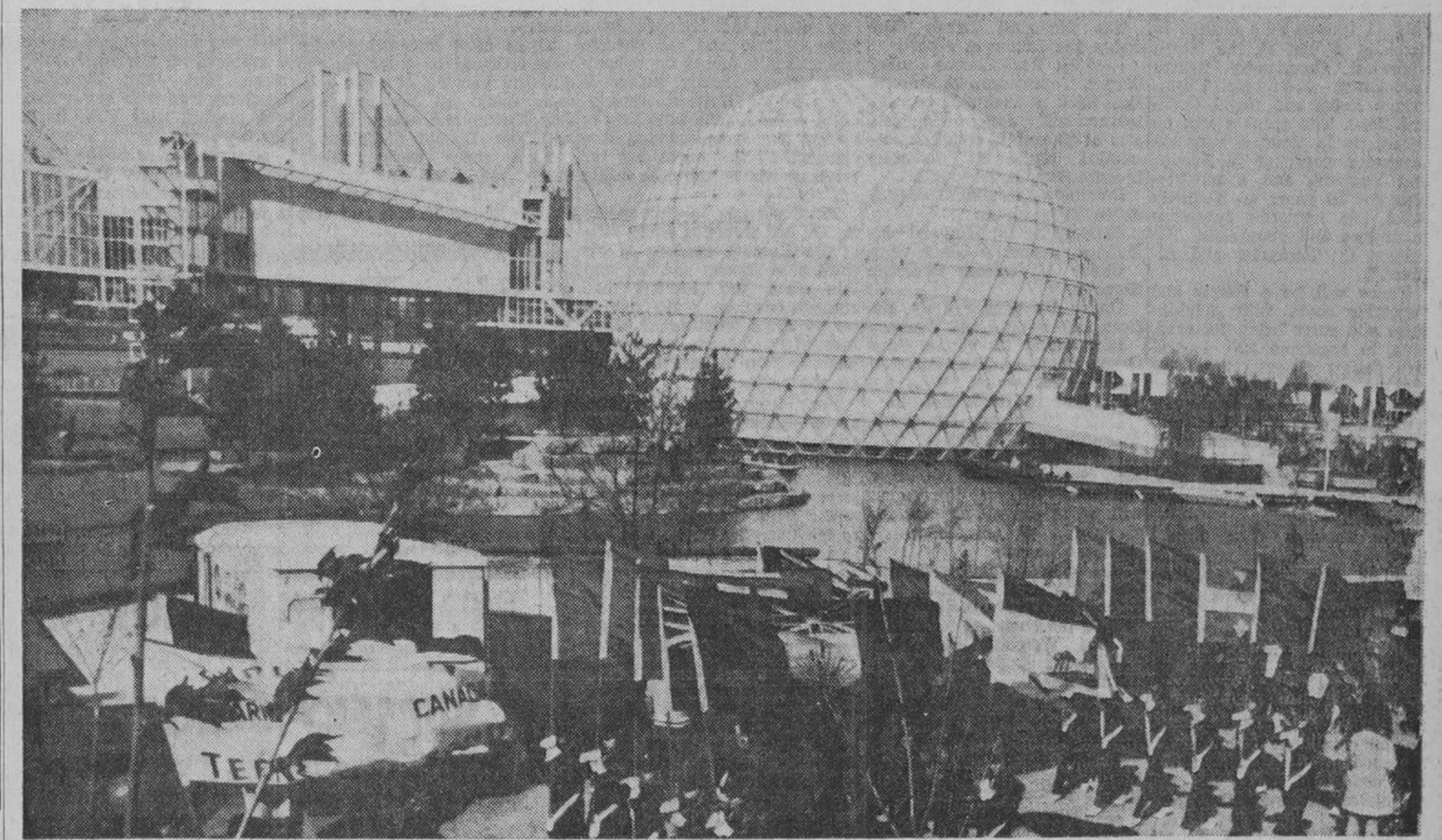

Three Fatalities Mar Dominion Day Weekend In Region Of York

Three fatalities marred the Dominion Day Weekend in the Region of York.
Killed instantly when the car in which he was riding went out of control on the CFRB Side-road in Richmond Hill July 1, was Daniel Sutton, 19, of 90 Temperance Street, Aurora.
Andre Gagne, 17, of 22 Wellington Street, Aurora, died the next day in Toronto General Hospital from injuries received in the accident.
