Rev. W.F. Wrixon 55 Yrs. Ministry

Friends of Rev. W.F. Wrixon, a former rector of St. Mary's Anglican Church, Richmond Hill, will be interested in learning that he recently celebrated the 55th anniversary of his ordination to the sacred ministry. Mr. Wrixon was the rector here from 1936 to 1952. During part of that time he served as Rural Dean also. At a service of thanksgiving held in St. John's Church, Port Hope, where Mr. Wrixon is honorary assistant, gifts were presented to him by the church wardens on behalf of the congregation, and a letter from the Bishop of the Diocese, expressing his appreciation of Mr. Wrixon's ministry, was read by the rector. Following the service a reception was held in the parish hall, to give parishioners the opportunity to greet the Wrixons. Mrs. Wrixon was presented with a bouquet of carnations. Before coming to Richmond Hill Mr. Wrixon had served as rector at King, Jefferson and Maple. It is hoped that he will be in Richmond Hill in November in connection with the centennial celebrations of St. Mary's Anglican Church.

Scarboro Mortimers Pull Out Of League

Sports club pulls out of Toronto and District Senior Football League President Bill Hurst has announced that Lou Mortimer, owner-manager of Scarboro Mortimers Football Club, has withdrawn his team from further competition this season. Mortimer cited lack of depth in his pitching personnel as the major reason for his club's difficulties. "Loss of my first string hurler with an injury and the unreliability of a back-up man who travels on the road in his job deletes my mound talent," said Mortimer. Scarboro lost all six games played and were outscored 67 to 6. Mortimer added that "in the best interests of my players and the league I feel that it is only fair that I remove my team from further competition. Hurst felt that if they were to reappear next season with better financing and more talented players Mortimers would be allowed to rejoin the league. Scarboro had played four games against Eastern Division teams and the points from these games will stand. However, the results of two contests against teams in the Central Division will be removed from the records. A revised schedule through August 24 has been released by the league.
