Dedication Service New Free Methodist Church, Sept. 17

The church dedication service is a part of a weekend of renewal and dedication beginning September 15, and ending September 17, Bishop John will be the main speaker with other special guests taking part. The Jubilaires will provide special music for the weekend.

The friends of the church, and the people of the community are invited to share with the congregation in this great service of church dedication. Parking is adequate, and nursery facilities will be fully staffed.

Vaughan Farmer Has Second Fire

A Vaughan area farmer, who had his entire stock of pigs wiped out in a fire of unknown origin a month ago, had his house partially destroyed by fire last week.

The fire occurred at the home of William Burbridge, RR 2, Woodbridge, and caused \$7,000 damage to the house and \$3,000 damage to the contents. Vaughan fire officials said the blaze was believed to have started in the electrical system. Six fire trucks, four tankers and two pumps, answered the call, which was turned in at 9:52 pm.

AUGUST BLAZE
Last August, a late night barn fire at the farm, which burned for six hours, destroyed 400 pigs and caused an estimated \$35,000 damage.

Another fire in Vaughan also believed to have started from a fault in the electrical system, caused about \$400 damage to a truck in the CN yards at Keele Street and Highway 7, September 5 about 2:50 am.

SMOKING IN BED
Smoking in bed resulted in a fire at the Cannon residence, 21 Fran Drive, Woodbridge, Friday about 12:15 am. Damage amounted to \$100.

Richmond Hill reported one fire at the Martin residence, North Road, Lake Wilcox.

Amendment No. 42 to amend the Secondary Plan for the North Thornhill - Thornlea area

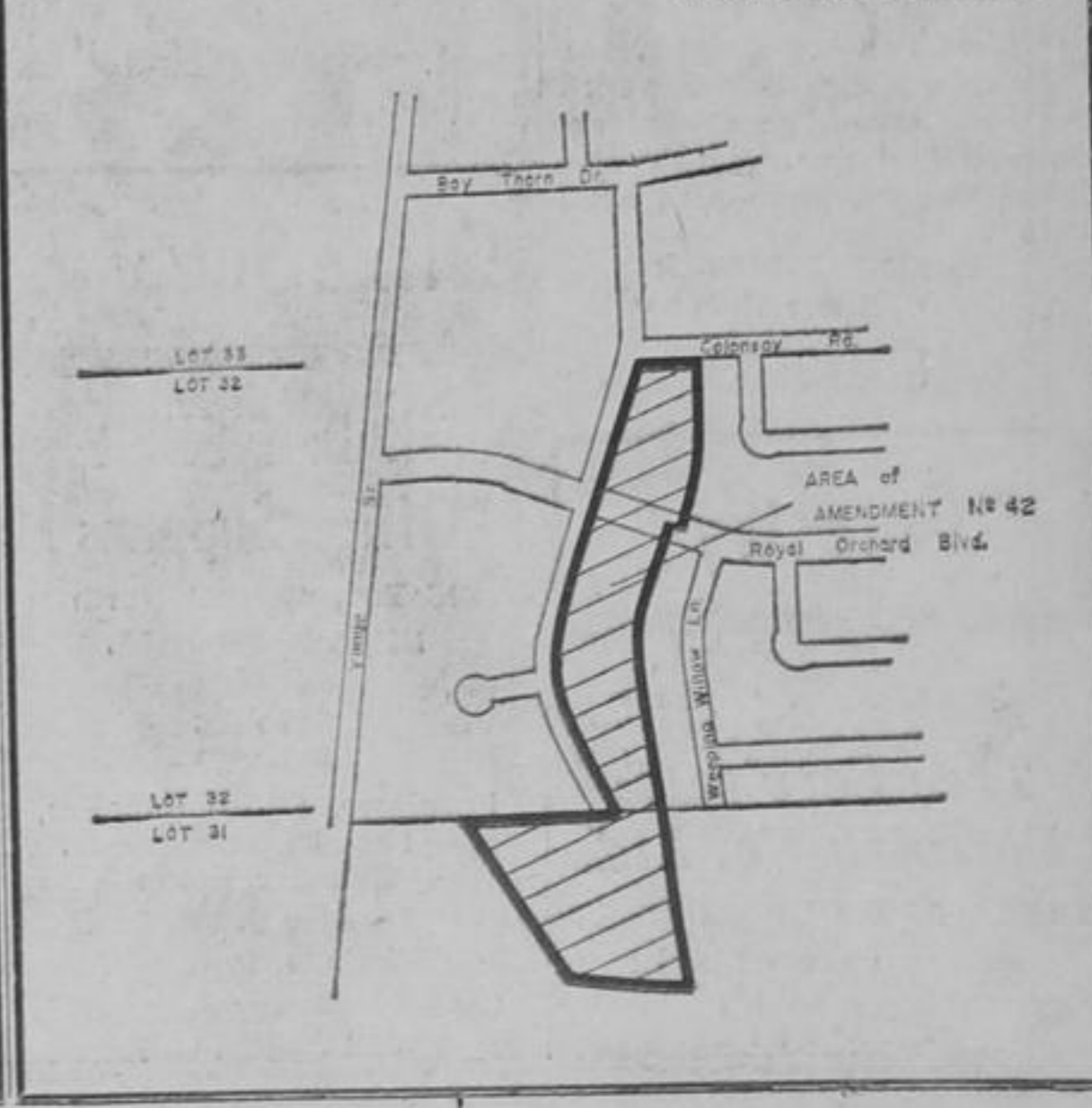
