

## Police Charge Two After Theft Of Buzz Saws From Markham Store

Two suspects were arrested and charged with theft over \$200 following the theft of three buzz saws from Markham Boat Sales, 36 Wellington Street East in Markham Saturday.

According to York Regional Police, three people entered the store about 5:20 pm. While one of them talked with the attendant, the others removed saws valued at \$507.

Remanded to September 18 when they appeared in Provincial Court in Richmond Hill Monday, were Robert Paterson, 18, of 78 Squire Baker's Lane, and Larry Casamiri, 24, of 111 Wellington Street East, both of Markham.

Panal Mohan, who resides in an apartment at the same address as Casamiri, reported to police that sometime between September 8 and 9, the glass in the front door of the building was smashed.

Value of the glass was \$100.

**MARKHAM BREAK-IN**

In a break-in at the home of Edward Lewis, Highway 48, Markham, a camera, radio and \$4 in coins were taken. Total value was \$84.90.

Entry was gained by breaking a screen door in the kitchen.

Police reported a relatively quiet week in Richmond Hill. Carl Wyse, 21-A Yonge Street, told police that while his car was parked on a lot at 34 Yonge Street North overnight between September 4 and 5, someone ripped the convertible roof.

Damage amounted to \$180. Police also reported a break-in at the GO Transit office on Newkirk Road Saturday evening.

The office was thoroughly ransacked. Entry was made through a rear door.

Police at press time were unable to say if anything had been taken.

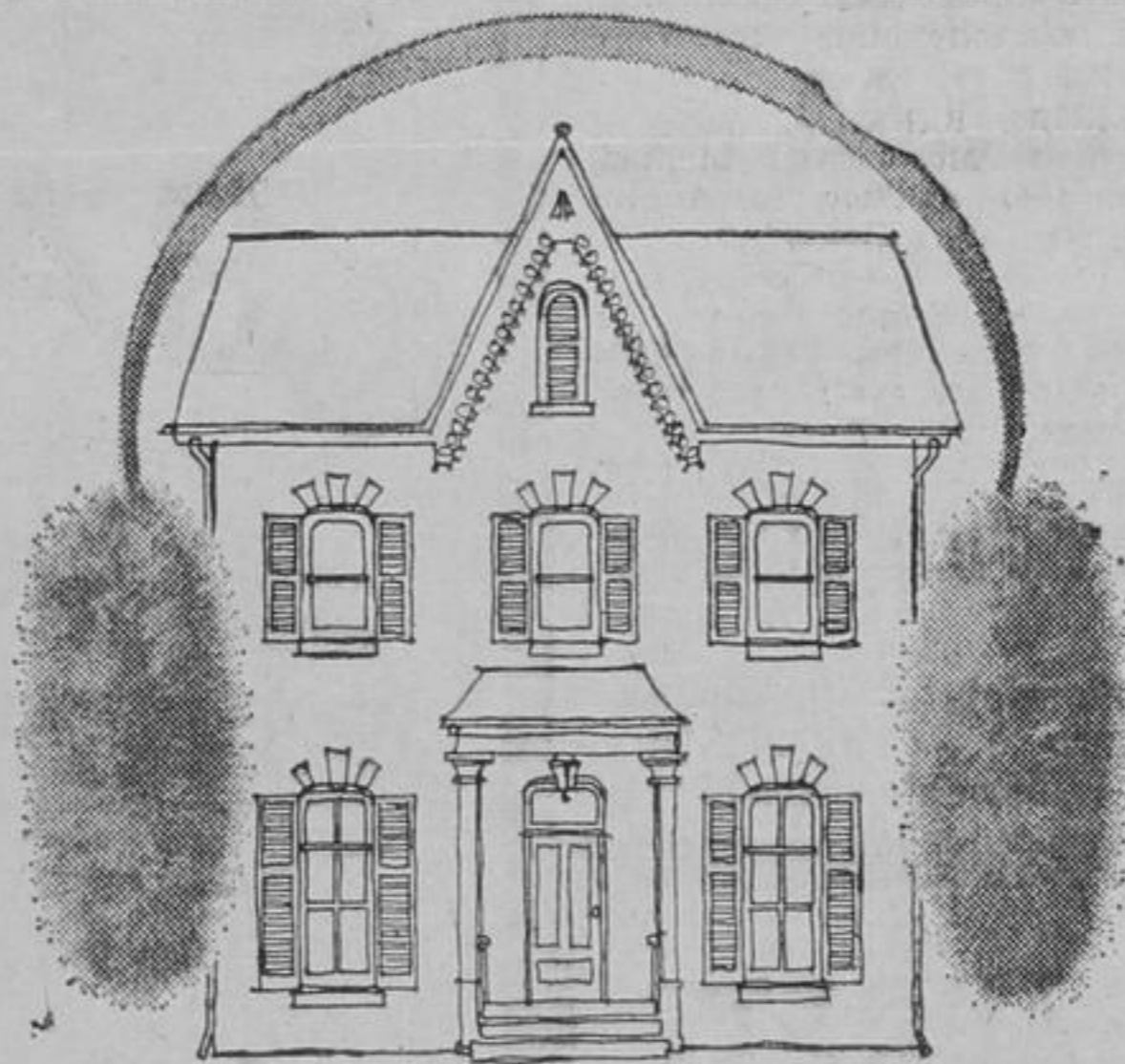

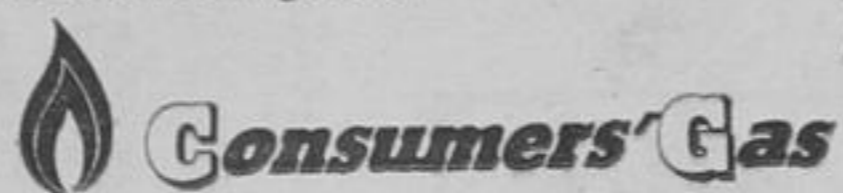
