### Crime Rate In York Region Still Climbing Slowly At End Of Month

An increased rate of crime to 1,236 cases so far this year. Assaults increased by 18 cases to 308 in the first eight months. Frauds are getting more frequent, up 45 cases to 317.

Offensive weapon cases are sharply on the increase, up 11 to 34. Wounding cases are up from six to seven. Sexual offenses are increasing, up 15 to 74 cases. Car thefts are down 51 to 367 cases.

**600 MONTHLY**

Criminal offenses reported are running at the rate of about 600 a month in York Region, not including drug cases.

Police Chief Crawford said he is pleased the region has only a slight increase of 1.98% in crime so far this year. He said he hopes to hold this low rate for the rest of the year. "Every man on the force is working hard", Chief Crawford said.

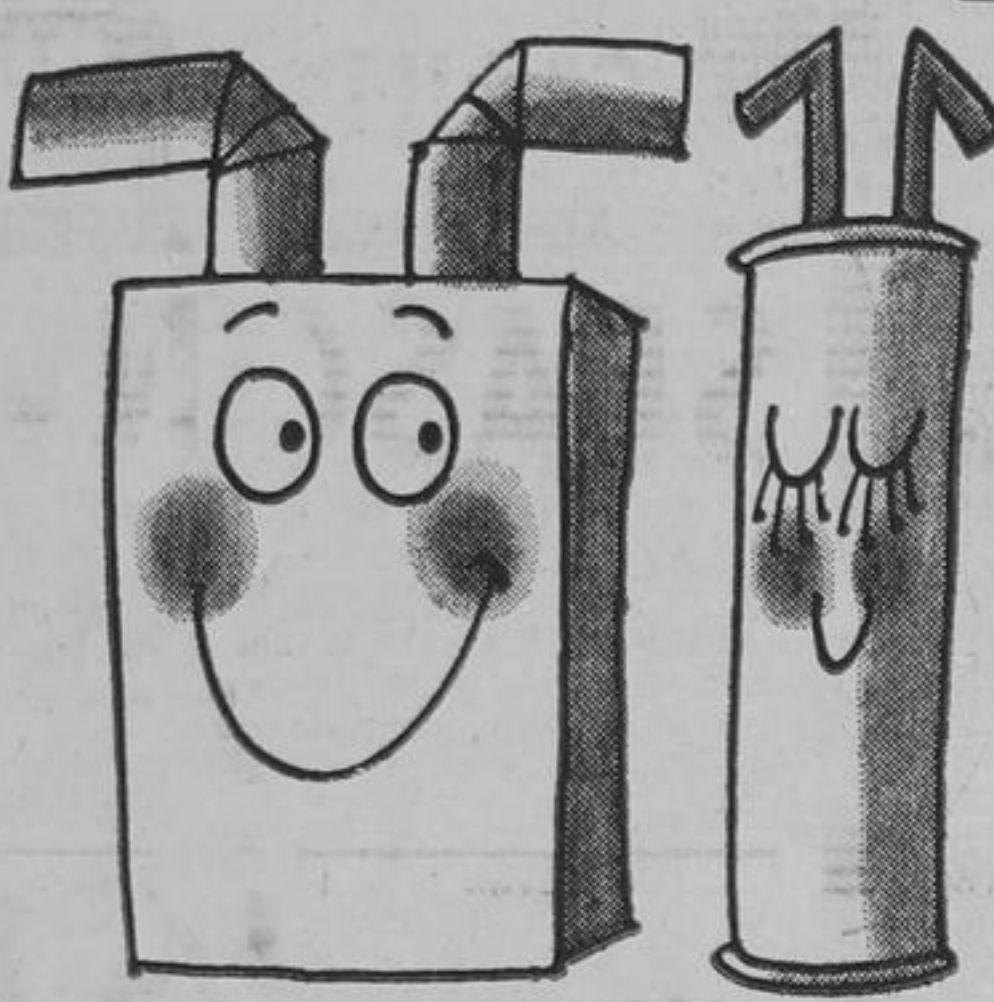
