RC Trustees Receive \$1,200
 York County Roman Catholic School Board Trustees receive an honorarium of \$1,200 per year, not the \$1,800 reported in our September 14 edition. Legislation permitting the payment of school trustees sets out rates based on the pupil population. If there were 5,000 or more pupils in the board's schools, the honorarium would be \$1,800 per year, but the total registration to date for this school year is just slightly under the 5,000 figure.
 Even when qualified for the higher rate, the trustees will have to pass an implementing bylaw before it comes into effect.

Abortion To Be Topic Talk On 10 Hot Line
 Proponents of both sides of the touchy subject of abortion will be featured this week on Richmond Hill cable TV Channel 10's popular live open line program Talk On 10 shown at 9:30 o'clock each Thursday night.
 Host Kerry Gilmor, the TV 10 program director, has invited two ladies who are leaders for their respective sides in the public battle concerning abortion.
 Mrs. Gwen Landolt of 280 Essex Avenue, Richmond Hill is chairman of the Right to Life Association and the other program guest, Mrs. Rozelyn Doctorow is a representative of the York Women's Caucus to Advance the Right to Abortion. Mrs. Landolt's group this week is planning to hold a vigil at a Metro hospital against the large number of abortions said to be carried out there.

Ont. Hydro Asks Union Members To Vote On Offer

An attempt this past week of \$6.25 an hour in 1974 for Ontario Hydro to end the three-month-old strike by 12,000 of its 23,000 employees has failed. According to Spence Urquhart, acting manager of Hydro's Markham Area, the public utility has offered its striking employees a three year contract with a minimum wage increase of 16% and a maximum of 24%, plus a cost-of-living allowance and other concessions. Hydro has urged CUPE Local 1000 members to request a vote on the new offer. However, the union reports Ontario Hydro has demanded an agreement to protect members who have crossed picket lines from union-imposed penalties or discipline. The executive board of the union has agreed to submit hydro's wage and contract offer to a membership vote, but only if Hydro deletes this protection clause.
 The clause would also protect strikers against disciplinary measures by hydro for any action they may have taken during the strike.
 Hydro insists the clause is absolutely essential since there are about 500 union members crossing picket lines to report to work each day.
 The union claims the protective clause is unlawful, a violation of the union's constitution. Under the local's constitution any member has the right to lay charges against another for action detrimental to the union.
 Mr. Urquhart explained that the total value of the new offer over the three years would be \$33.3 million. It would provide an average wage increase of 7.15% in the first year, 6.3% in the second year and 6.35% in the third year. An additional cost of living adjustment in each of the second and third years is included.
 He explained, "The trades group would get a 22% increase, adding \$1.19 to the present rate of \$5.06 for a total
