Commuter Train Experimental Service Starts Nov. 1

The on-again, off-again first announced in June as getting underway this fall, November 1, John Roberts, MP, York Simcoe, announced at a press conference last week in Newmarket.

The five-week experimental service will bypass Rich- Maple, .90. Children will mond Hill on its daily trip pay half fare. service before it came out. Last week, explaining the reason for the short run of the trial service, Roberts said the trains would be using regular mainline equipment, which would be needed by the railway again for its own use for the peak
