



PROCLAMATION

## Fire Prevention Week OCTOBER 8th to 14th, 1972

WHEREAS it is desirable that the attention of the public be directed to the extent and underlying causes of the preventable loss of life and property by fire and to the best and most practicable means for its control and that a specific period of the year be set apart and property designated for the dissemination of such information:

NOW THEREFORE we recommend to all residents that at some time during that week as may be found most practicable —

- 1. All dwellings, public buildings, stores, warehouses, factories, farms, mines and forests be carefully inspected by their occupants and all conditions likely to cause or promote the spread of fire be removed.
- 2. All theatres, hotels, hospitals, and other institutional and assembly buildings be inspected and provision made for all changes necessary to protect the occupants in case of fire.
- 3. Fire drills be held for the children in all schools. for the inmates of all institutional buildings and for the employees n all factories, in order that a greater degree of safety by acquainting the occupants with the best and most expedious mode of exit in time of danger.
- 4. Special instruction on the subject of fire prevention be given by the teachers and by municipal officials in the schools and that such appropriate literature as may be available be distributed to the pupls.
- 5. Federal, Provincial and Municipal authorities endeavour, by means of public meetings, the press, television, radio broadcasts, or specially prepared visual aids as may to them seem most fit, to impress upon the citizens the national importance of protecting life, property and natural resources from loss by fire.
