Play got underway in a steady downpour of rain which made ball control very difficult and exchanges for the first 20 minutes were pretty evenly contested with both sides making mistakes on the greasy terrain.

The Rangers persisted and got the first goal with Ivan Brown doing the honors after being set up by Horst Del-schlegel and Billy Keenan.

Barney Danson Announces

Liberal Youth Program To Provide Winter Work Cutting Dead Elms

Some 100 youth in four different communities may get jobs starting December 1 under a Youth Environmental Service (YES) program unveiled this week by York North Liberal Candidate Barney Danson.

Any youth who refuses a job offered under YES program will forfeit his right to unemployment benefits.

Danson, who was parliamentary secretary to Prime Minister Trudeau in the last Parliament said the youth would be used to cut down Dutch Elm Trees and would be paid \$2.00 an hour.

He said that he wrote mayors in the municipalities of Richmond Hill, Vaughan, Markham and the Borough of North York

outlining the program and asking them to meet with him to put it into operation.

Danson said the Youth Environmental Service (YES) should qualify under the federal government's Local Initiative Program and would not only give youths at least six months of work but would, by cutting down the dead and dying trees, be of real service to the communities.

He pointed out that some older experienced men would also be needed to show the participants how to use chain saws and other equipment to cut down trees and that they would be paid about \$3.00 an hour, thus creating additional jobs for mature unemployed.
