The Satan's Choice motorcycle group was linked to a horrible assault at a Richmond Hill tavern that may blind a Newmarket man in one eye, according to York Regional Police reports last week.

The motorcyclists were also linked to a Markham Town break-in and theft from a residence.

A man with a history of association with the motorcyclists is a suspect in the 12:45 am Saturday bottle assault causing bodily harm at the back door of the Richmond Motor Inn, Yonge Street South.

**BOTTLE SMASHED FACE**

Police said James Raymond, 31, of Gorham Street, Newmarket was leaving the rear door of the tavern when a bottle was smashed in his face, knocking him to the ground. Raymond began to get up and was kicked in the face. He fell down again.

The injured man was taken to York Central Hospital where at press time he was recovering from lacerations to the face and right eye, a fractured nose, a cut upper lip and damage to the iris of the eye.

Police said a Richmond Hill youth with a Satan's Choice history is being sought as a suspect.

A car known to be driven by Satan's Choice members was caught at the scene of a housebreaking at Markham Road and Woodbine Avenue (formerly Don Mills Road) by a neighbor at about 7:40 pm Friday night.
