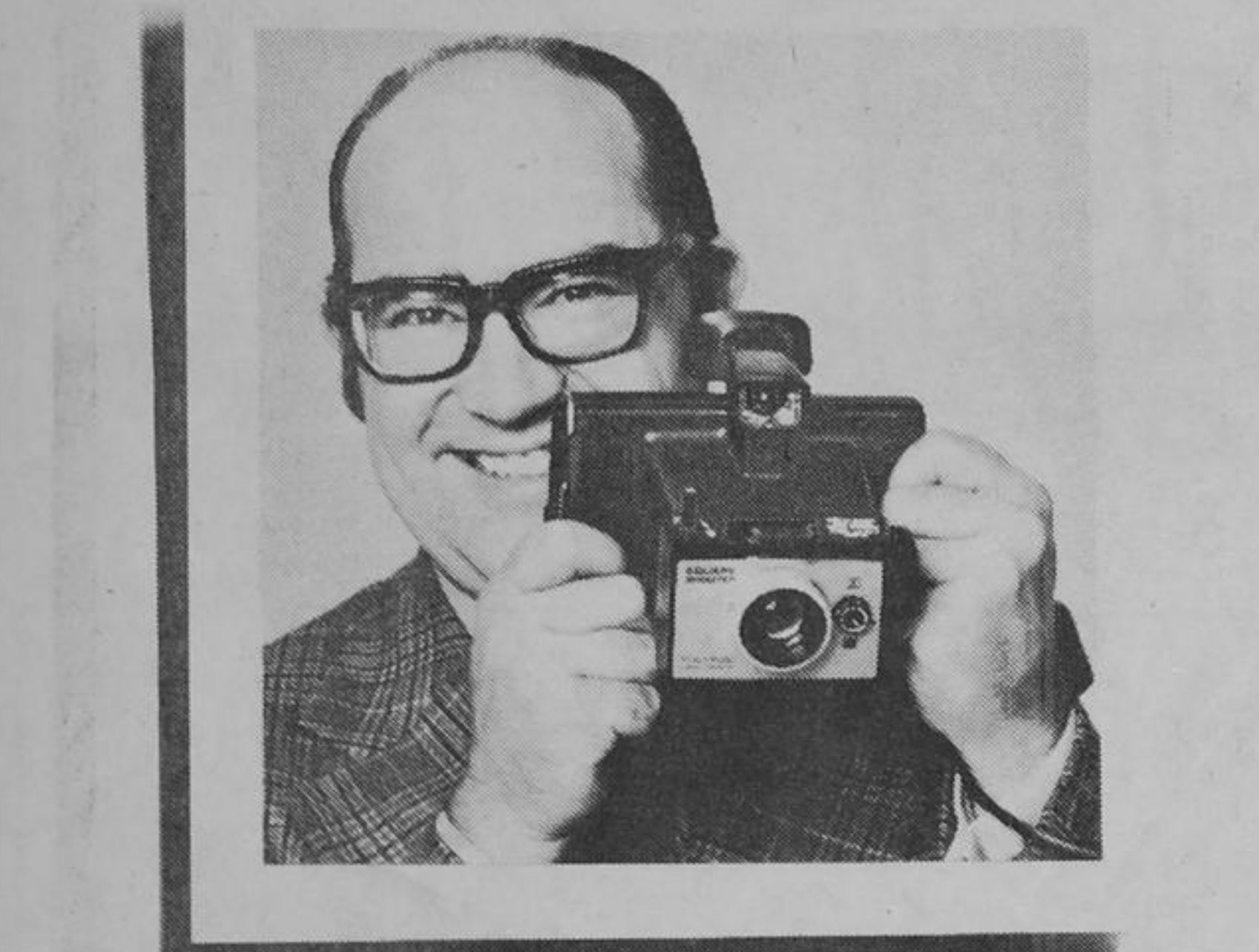

Jam Session

"Jam Session" is a music column — a newcomer to "The Liberal". And believe me, it's been a long time coming. Four years ago, I was a grade 11 student at Bayview Secondary. It was then that I first became interested in writing and my English teacher suggested I try doing a weekly column for "The Liberal". Well, I never got around to writing that column but I did take up journalism at Humber College, Rexdale. I am now in my third year there and I've decided to go back and pick up all the loose ends of my career. So here I am — writing "Jam Session". I hope you'll enjoy it, even if it is four years too late!

Perhaps you're wondering why I decided to tackle a music column, instead of a general feature article. Well, for one thing I'm interested in music — its artists and promoters. I also have great faith in the potential of the Canadian music market. Take for instance, A&M's latest discovery — Lorence Hud. If you haven't heard of him yet, you soon will. For the past three months A & M Record Company has been throwing teaser ads in all the music trade magazines to arouse interest in Lorence Hud. The ads simply read "Hud Is". And they did the trick. Everyone in the music industry was wondering who Hud was. Never before had a Canadian record company put such faith behind a new artist. Lorence Hud may be the breakthrough in Canadian promotion. For years, the States has given their bands such promotional build-up that they can't help but succeed. Canada has never stood behind her performers with such strength, but Hud could be a beginning.

Of course, Lorence Hud had to be a unique artist to deserve such royal treatment. His album, simply entitled "Lorence Hud", is proof of that. Incredible as it may seem, Hud put this entire album together single handedly. He wrote all the material, did all the vocals, and played all instruments, which included guitar, drums, bass, tenor sax, vibes, piano, mellotron, harpsichord, organ and glockenspiel. I can't think of another Canadian artist who has accomplished such a feat.

This 25 year old multi-talented musician hails from Saskatoon. He did a lot of travelling throughout his teenage years, playing weekends and summer tours, in order to put himself through musical studies at the university of Saskatchewan. It was there that he learned to master the numerous instruments which he plays on his album. Hud played with various Saskatoon bands during this time — and more memorable ones including the Thunderbirds, the Shadows, the Keymen and For Keeps.

The impact of these early years of travelling on the road is summed up in a cut off the album, called "Travellin' Show". Hud claims it took him 10 years of one-night stands to write that song. The other cuts on the album include Summer Rose, Grab Hold & Hang On, Kind Hearted Woman, Where to Begin, Master of Pantomime, Someone I Know, Lost In The Crowd, Siren in the Night, We'll Get That Good Feeling Tonite and the just-released single Sign of the Gypsy Queen.

And that's Lorence Hud. Add Neil Young, the Guess Who, Joni Mitchell, Crowbar, Bruce Cockburn, and the Stampeders. What do you have then? Canadian talent with a capital "C".

Careless Driving In Vandorf Death

Careless driving of a separate school bus was found to be the cause of the accidental death of a Vandorf school child last week when the driver appeared in Newmarket Provincial Court.

Mrs. Maureen McManingwell, 40, of RR 3, Newmarket admitted driving carelessly in the October 12 accident and was fined \$100. She'd been charged with criminal negligence in the death of Jo-Anne Coughlan, 8, of Whitchurch-Stouffville.

Assistant Crown Attorney William Rankin told the court there appeared to be a major conflict in evidence from all the witnesses on how the accident happened. Mrs. McManingwell drove from St. Mark's Roman Catholic Separate School in Stouffville and dropped the girl across the road from home. A brother Michael, 10, left the bus as well, while another brother Kevin, 16, was selling vegetables at a nearby stand.

He said Jo-Anne was hit by the front end of the bus and then apparently run over by the rear wheels. But he added it didn't appear there was wanton disregard of safety although the driver failed to keep a proper lookout.

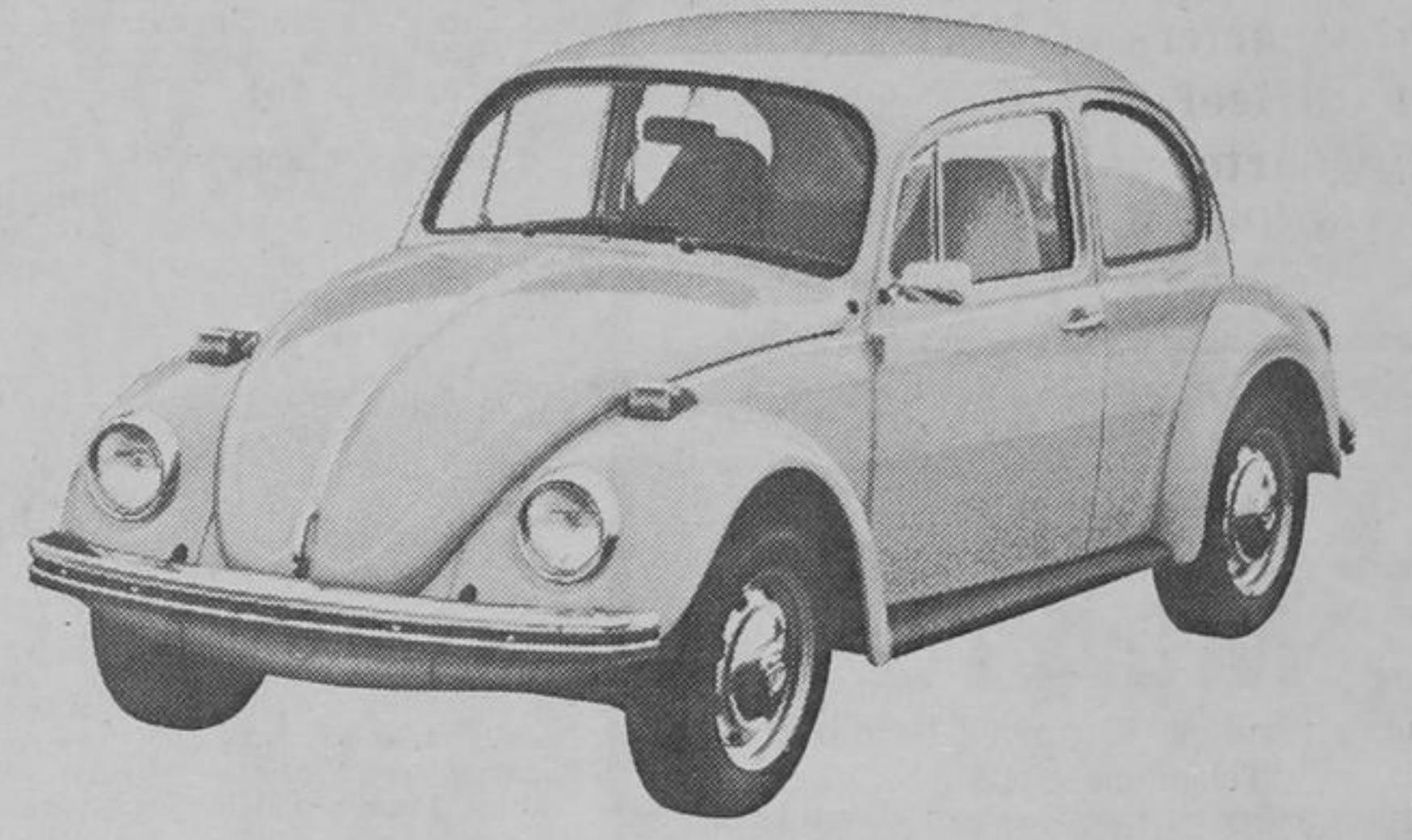
