



Some of the rules are as follows: The eight man defense, seven-man offense, two-hand touch game of football is played according to the official Canadian Football League rules with the exceptions and additions added by

the various leagues. The teams must move the yard-sticks 20 yards for a first down, you get six points for a touchdown by pass and run, or interception return; five points for a touchdown by a quarterback run, three points for a field goal, two points for a safety touch or for conversion by kicking, one point for a rouge, conversion by running or kicking.

So there you have it. Touch football for you fellows who are too affluent (around the waist) for tackle yet not old enough to be cast aside. Another good conditioner.


