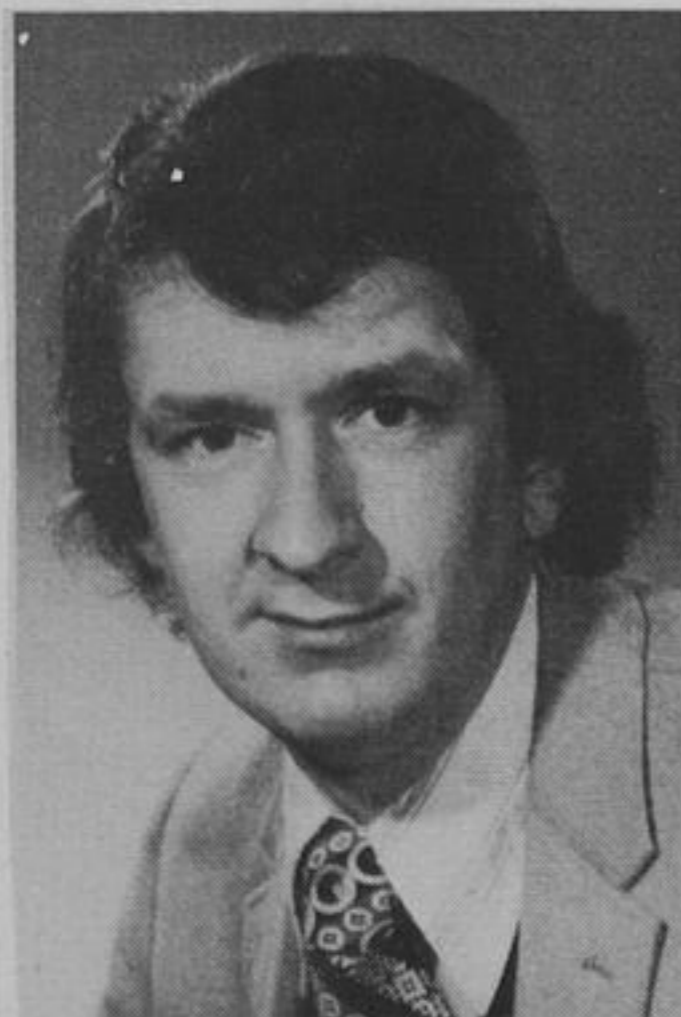

Drinking Motorists Jailed, Fined, Barred

A jail sentence, fines and long driving suspensions were handed out to drinking motorists in Richmond Hill Court on Thursday of last week. A Markham youth already in jail for robbery got three months more for apartment wrecking.

Ernest Keefe, 38, of 4864-A Yonge Street, Willowdale was jailed 25 days and prohibited from driving anywhere in the nation for two years. After that his driving is suspended six months in Ontario by the Transport Department.

At that he got off lucky because Crown Attorney John Kerr had to withdraw a further charge of suspended driving because a York Regional Police officer had served Keefe with a notice that was on the wrong legal form.

Keefe with two other persons faces further charges at a future date arising out of an altercation with YRP.

He denied a July 6 Richmond Hill impaired driving charge and was convicted after Judge Russell Pearce heard police testimony.

weeks to pay, putting the deadline past Christmas, although Judge Pearce remarked he finds some people in his experience seem to have more money to pay fines before Christmas than after. Campbell's license to drive is automatically suspended three months as well.

A 16-year-old boy who improperly left the House of Concord and stole a bicycle was remanded back to the Salvation Army residence on \$200 personal bail for five weeks to see if he could behave himself before facing sentence.

David Pierce, 18, or RR 2, Gormley was sentenced to three months jail in addition to a sentence already being served for robbery. He was also put on two years probation after release.

PROBATION TERMS
The terms of his probation were that he avoid the company of his two co-accused, Bonnie Peters, 17, and Edward Ferrell, 19, and within six months of release pay

Court NEWS

PERJURED EVIDENCE

Crown Attorney Kerr said Keefe had given "blatantly false perjured evidence" in an "attempt to perpetrate a fraud upon Your Honor". Keefe denied being driver of the car, saying an acquaintance whose last name he didn't know had run off with the keys, leaving him in the car.

YRP Constable Douglas Strong, a breathalyzer operator, testified Keefe was brought to the station by YRP Constable Peter Bullivant and had a breath test reading of 2.00. This was the equivalent of six bottles of beer or nine ounces of spirits. Strong said from the reading and physical tests, he concluded Keefe's ability to drive was impaired by alcohol.

RAN RED LIGHT

Constable Bullivant told the court he was eastbound on Centre Street when he saw a fast-moving vehicle southbound on Newkirk Road that went through a red traffic light. He followed the vehicle to the GO Transit terminal, where it entered the lot by the exit and turned out its lights, taking apparent evasive action. Bullivant testified he stopped the vehicle and told the driver to turn off the engine. This the driver did, but when he came to take the driver's keys, he found the driver had disposed of them somehow.

Judge Pearce said Keefe had given an explanation "I cannot believe whatsoever".

PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS

Crown Attorney Kerr told the court Keefe was convicted May 15 for impaired driving and December 3 last year for refusing to take a breathalyzer test. He noted the minimum sentence for this second impaired driving conviction was 14 days jail, with the maximum being 90 days in jail. He said the penalty should be more than the minimum in view of the accused man's apparent perjury.

Kerr withdrew an additional charge of failing a breathalyzer test after Keefe was convicted of impaired driving.

James Coyle, 57, of Church Street, Colborne, a Transport Department gravel pit inspector, denied charges of impaired driving and refusing a breathalyzer test.

He was convicted after trial. His fines were \$100 or 30 days for impaired driving and \$50 or 10 days for refusing to take his test. His license was automatically suspended for three months on each conviction.

ASTHMA, WAR INJURY

Coyle was arrested September 12 at 1:50 pm because of his driving while southbound at Kipling Avenue and Highway 7 in Vaughan, YRP Constable Gordon LeMoine told the court.

Coyle maintained his physical symptoms of impairment were due to asthma and a crippled leg injury when a land mine blew up under him during World War II. He said he tried his best to blow into the breathalyzer machine but was suffering at the time from his asthma.

Colin Campbell, 33, of 190 Exbury Road, Apartment 102, Downsview, a married CN employee with a child, admitted an impaired driving charge and a breathalyzer reading that astonished Crown Attorney Kerr.

TREMENDOUS CAPACITY

"He must have a tremendous capacity for alcohol. I don't think I could get that high without passing out," said Kerr as he told the court of a test reading at a high 2.80. The maximum allowed by law is 0.80.

Campbell was stopped by police at 2:30 am the day before his court appearance while driving south on Jane Street approaching Highway 7 West.

He was fined \$175 or 30 days jail and given five

back his \$125 share of damage.

He wilfully damaged a main Street Markham apartment the day after he was put on three years probation, the court was told.

Jerry McDonald, 28, of 77 Metcalfe Street, Aurora, a man with a pregnant wife on welfare and a long history of jail, was given a \$300 fine or 6 months jail for stealing 10 chairs from a public building in Thornhill.

2 YEARS PROBATION

He was allowed to go free with time to pay after \$30 was paid into the court. He was put on probation under supervision for two years and ordered to keep the peace and be of good behavior.

McDonald was told to support his family, have no weapons, stay in the court's jurisdiction, and report changes of address and job.

Having heard McDonald usually gets into trouble when influenced by a stepbrother now being sought by police for failing to appear in court, Judge Pearce told McDonald not to associate with his step-brother during the probation period.

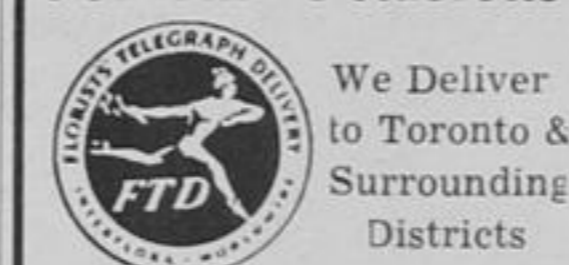

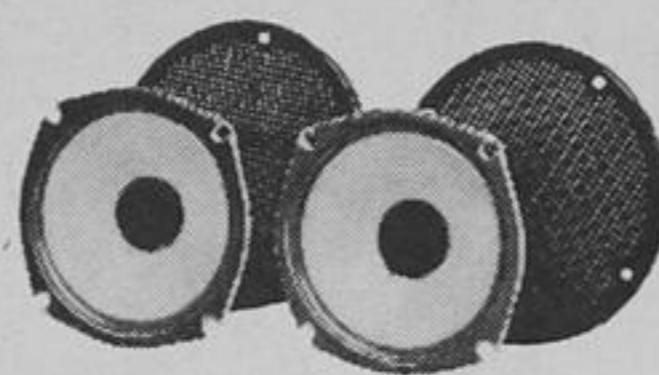
