## Board Letter Creates Impasse

An attempt to get together with York County secondary teachers to discuss "teacher redundancy" has run into some opposition from the salary chairman of District 11 of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation. It was disclosed at a meeting of the county board of education November 27.

The impasse resulted from an open letter sent to all secondary school teachers from Sam Chapman, director of the board of education, on behalf of the board.

In his letter Mr. Chapman pointed out that the former decreasing pupil-teacher ratios had now given over to static or increasing pupil-teacher ratios.

"When this situation is combined with the freedom to choose subjects inherent in HS 1 (student credit system) and the proliferation of new courses, it is inevitable that teacher redundancy in various forms is a problem to be solved."

He said that some teachers were not required in their own schools at present, while others might be able to be employed in the subject area of their specialist certification.

"In York County we can probably cope with most situations by re-assignment, but it is natural for teachers to feel some uneasiness," Mr. Chapman wrote.

It was a complex situation and the board had asked

him to study all aspects and to consult with the teachers on it, he said.

To ensure response from every school, he suggested a staff representative from each one to serve on a committee, which would meet about three times. From this a sub-committee would be formed to meet on several other occasions.

Mr. Chapman emphasized that it would be a study, "not a negotiation to a position."

He said also that it might be a "useful background paper for the salary committee (teachers and trustees)."

He said it was a "sincere and open approach" to explore all dimensions of the matter and generate some possible solutions.

It did not in any way represent an attempt to avoid discussing with the salary committee a topic which could affect salary, he said.

In the OSSTF publication "Update," Dave Robinson, Langstaff Secondary School, District 11 Salary Chairman, said that "Any attempt to establish a second committee to speak for teachers, as Mr. Chapman is now doing, is a deliberate attempt to bypass your official salary representative and to create a division among us."

He said that District 11 OSSTF Salary Committee was "the competent spokesman for all teachers on salary matters," and requested the board pursue all salary and categorization discussions directly through it.

Trustee Arthur Starr of Whitechurch said the board had directed Mr. Chapman to write the letter, and it had been written with good intentions. The OSSTF had misinterpreted it.

Chairman Ross Jolliffe of Vaughan, said the board had made a "very serious effort to communicate with the teachers." Whether the letter had been misinterpreted intentionally or not, he didn't know.
