# Develop School Family Life Course

Christian Family Life Education has been introduced into almost all Roman Catholic schools in York Region according to a recent report issued by the York County Roman Catholic School Board. The program in use is the result of more than three years of consultation with family life experts, pastors, nurses, doctors, teachers, principals and parents. About 59 teachers, selected and sponsored by the board, have received in-depth training at the Family Life Institute, directed by Father Leo Lafrenier, proportionately higher than most school boards in the province. Another 14 teachers and principals have already indicated interest in taking the summer course at Waterloo next summer.

It is also aimed at fostering respect for the sexuality of oneself and of others based on the understanding of the "wonderful" role man and woman have in God's plan of creation. Before the course is introduced in any school a series of three to six lectures are conducted for the parents of the children in the school. These instructional sessions outline the exhaustive course guidelines prepared in conjunction with family life educators. Parents are encouraged to make suggestions and offer alternatives to any part of the curriculum. The teacher's qualifications are also reviewed by the board of trustees before permission is granted for introduction of the course.

The program is essentially concerned with the development of Christian attitudes in all human relationships and is designed to strengthen family life despite the many pressures of modern society.

### Drama, Chocolate Sales Highlighted At RHHS

This April will mark the Richmond Hill High School Drama Club's sixteenth annual production. Readings for the play, which usually cover a period of approximately three weeks, have already begun. Following these there will be four months of rehearsals and finally the play itself.

Selecting and casting a play are two of the most interesting, as well as difficult tasks that a director encounters. He must not only keep in mind the limited number of actors and actresses available, but be able to judge each individual's suitability to a particular part. In doing this he takes into consideration physical appearance and tone of voice, but mainly questions whether or not in four months time this person can successfully portray a believable, persuasive character.

This is not as easy as it sounds; one of the most discouraging and frustrating situations can result from a director's assigning a part which, for some reason or another, the actor is not capable of mastering. In order to safeguard against this happening, the cast is said to be tentative for the first month or so, during which time any necessary changes can be made.

Twenty-five people have attended readings this year, and out of this number, around fifteen will make up the cast. The others will be connected with the production as either set designers, prompters, stage or lighting crew, make-up assistants or sound technicians.

So far the two plays read from have been "Berkely Square" by James Balderston and "The Anatomist" by J. M. Birdie. Another choice, "Milestones" will be read next week, and following this Teacher Roy Clifton, the director, will with the help of the club's senior members, make a decision as to which play should be done.

The idea of selling chocolates in order to raise funds, judging by the extraordinary support it has received from the entire student body, must be a good one. The \$2000 needed in order to have organized athletics and other extra-curricular activities, due to this support, no longer seems an unobtainable goal.

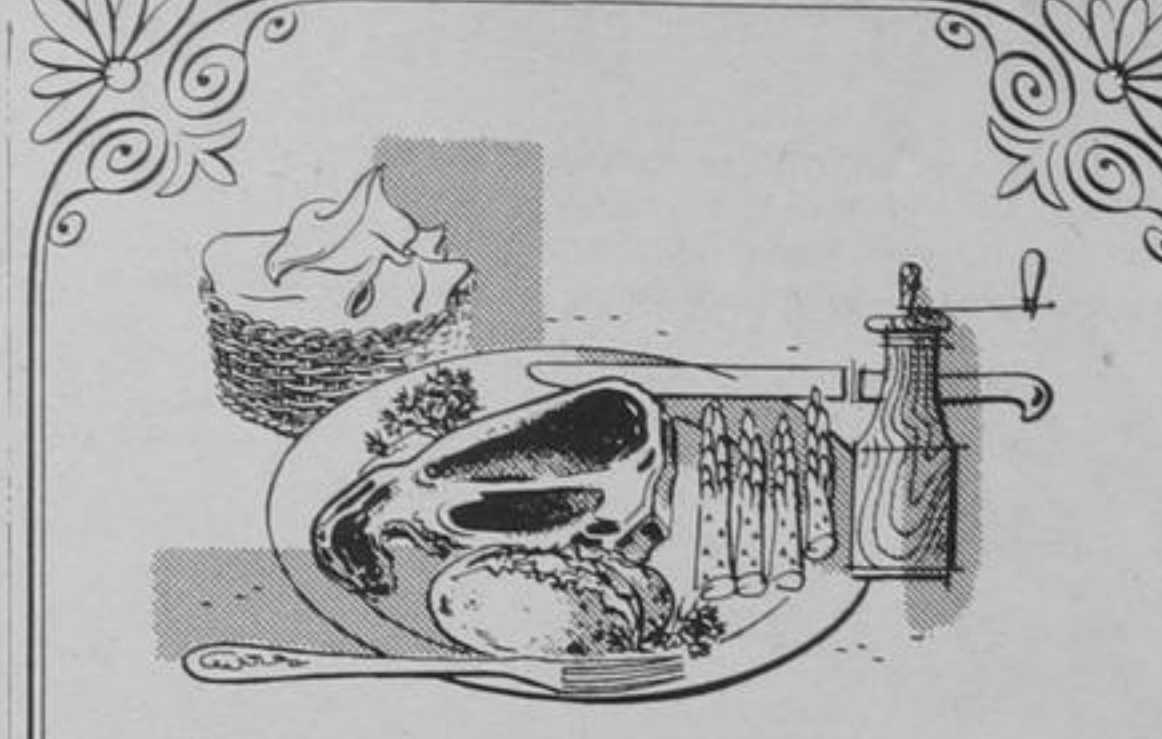

**Clothing Care Counselling**

**BE A SMART SHOPPER!**

Look for labels with clothing care instructions. Such labeling indicates responsible interest by the manufacturer and it helps the dry cleaner, whose job is complicated enough by today's fashions and fabrics.

- Brilliant whites, which may be fluorescent dyed will fade quickly in sunlight especially on wool and cannot usually be corrected by your cleaner.
- Leather and simulated leather trimming on fabric garments will sometimes bleed or become hard during cleaning.
- Surface design often on high style special occasion dresses, such as beads, sequins, flocking and embossed patterns can present problems in cleaning.

Do not assume that a fabric is dry cleanable if there is no mention of it on the label. Don't accept what you are told about fabrics, either—get it in writing.

Modern fabrics are becoming so complicated that in many cases you are unable to judge their content, quality and performance and you must depend on manufacturer's labels, brand names and your retailer's experience and integrity.

Be wary of some articles unless you have a written assurance that they are cleanable.
