York Regional Police

French Bulldogs Stolen In King

Three French bulldogs, valued at \$300 each, were stolen from Tulachmore Frenchies Kennels, RR 2, King Township, it was reported by York Regional Police.
 Police said the dogs had been left outside for about five minutes January 15, when they were taken.
 They were described as cream colored, natural bobbed tails, tattooed on left flank with the letters ONX.
 A would-be robber shot out a flood light at Smiley Land Fill, Concession 3, King Township, January 21, smashed some windows in the side of the building and then broke in.
 Once inside they ransacked the offices, but nothing was believed taken, police said.
 Damage amounted to \$100.
 In a third incident in the township, vandals slashed four tires on a bus belonging to Langdon's Coach Lines Company Limited, 266 Keele Street South, while it was parked on the United Church lot in Nobleton. Damage was estimated at \$73.
 More than \$450 in cash, candy, meat and cigarettes was taken in a break-in at Keele Valley Restaurant, 70 Sidercroft Road, in the Concord area of Vaughan, January 17.
 Entry was gained by breaking a window.
 Thieves used the same method to break into Concor Public School, Dufferin Street, and to steal a tape recorder valued at \$100, between January 19 and 21.
 Walker's Shell Station, Highway 7, Woodbridge, continues to be hit.
 For the second week in a row, the office was broken into and an attempt was made to break into the cash register.

Launch Addiction Program

An orientation meeting was held in Richmond Hill Monday to acquaint representatives from the community, libraries, service clubs, schools with "Project Decision", sponsored by the Addiction Research Foundation in co-operation with citizens of Richmond Hill.
 On February 7, 14, 21 and 28, Richmond Hill Cablevision, channel 10, will broadcast a series of programs stressing the co-relation of decision-making and addiction.
 A pilot project, it will involve the community individually and collectively. The organizers are hoping that through family and neighborhood groups watching the programs in their own living rooms, up to 3,000 people will become involved in the project.
 Resources kits have been prepared and are available free from public libraries, the YWCA in Richmond Hill and the Addiction Research Foundation, 55 Doncaster Road in South Thornhill. For mail orders call 889-0441.
 The idea for the project grew out of a part of the family life education program in Roman Catholic Schools in the region. Parents play an important part in this program, and those in the Richmond Hill area were particularly impressed with a presentation made at St. Mary Immaculate Roman Catholic School by Mrs. Vera Sing of the Addiction Research Centre.
 Mrs. Sing was invited to meet again with a group of local residents — a cross-section of the community including educators, clergy, mental and public health workers, family services, the YWCA and numerous service clubs.
 "As a result "Project Decision" was prepared and coordinated under direction of Don Graaf of the Addiction Research Foundation, four programs were filmed and resource kits prepared.
 The films on Channel 10 will be broadcast every hour on the half hour from 6:30 to 11:30 pm on each of the four consecutive Wednesdays so that families and groups can work out their own programs for viewing.
 If the response warrants it, video tapes will be made available to schools, agencies and business organizations for use along with the free resource kit.

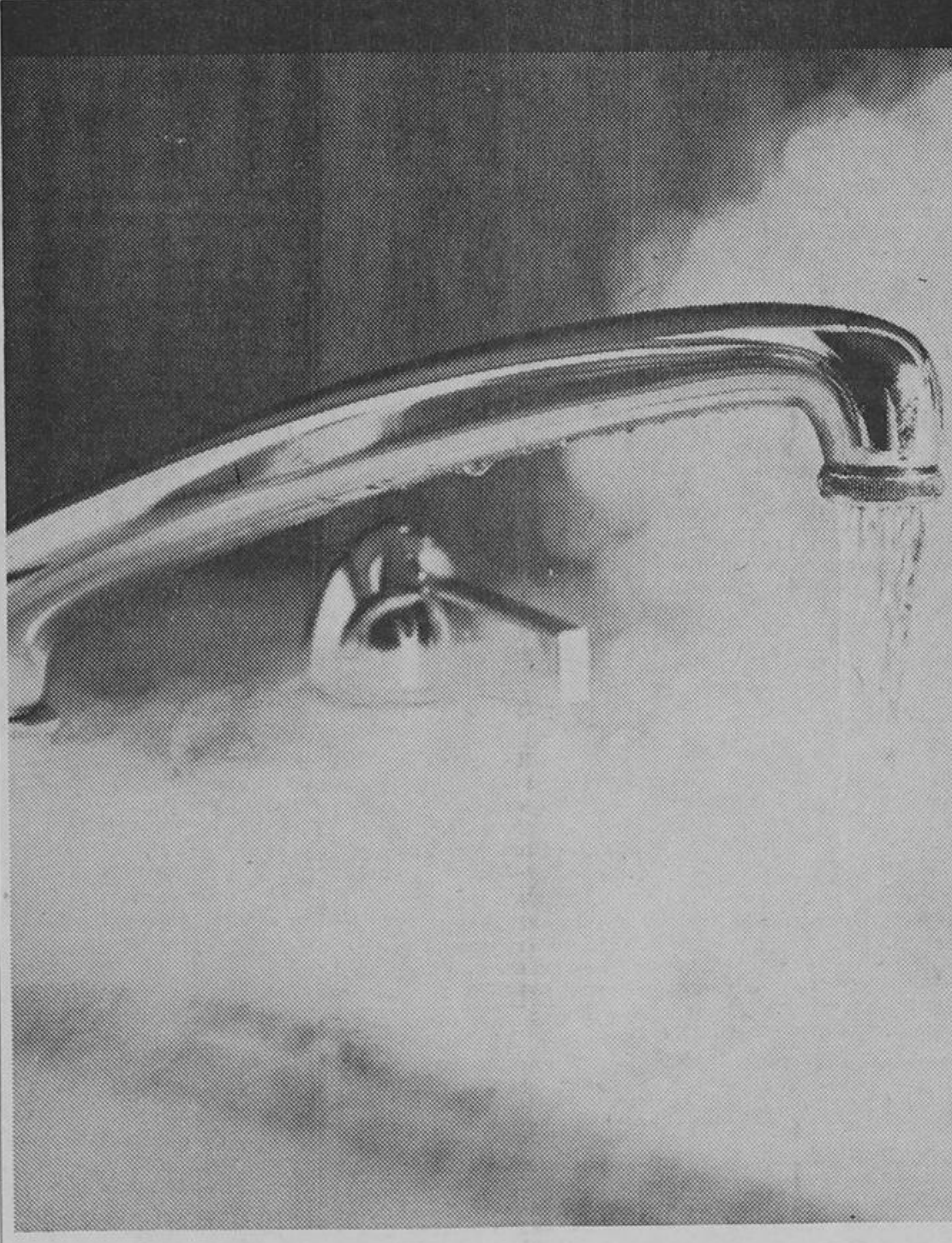
