

If you haven't already received it, in the next few days you'll be getting your new Postal Code in the mail. It's not very exciting to look at. But it is very necessary. And it's really not as complicated as it looks.

After two years of studying the systems of most of the countries of the world, here's how we developed Postal Codes for Canada.

The map sequence on the right shows just how accurate Postal Codes really are.

To uncomplicate your Postal Code, you will be receiving a Postal Code Package. It contains your code, instructions on how to use it, a handy address book, special

Postal Code stickers for your envelopes, and postage paid address cards that you should send to your friends. If you don't have enough, you can get as many as you need at your nearest Post Office. Because, after all, your Code doesn't move your mail unless


