The members of the RHHS Band and orchestra and the grade 9 band and string orchestra did a number of excellent pieces throughout the programme, as did the four individual soloists. Tim Buell and Mark Crawford each played two classical guitar numbers, while David McCartney and Karen Wright both did very good piano pieces.

And finally, the conductor-director, Miss Elizabeth Mathews, deserves special mention for the amount of time and effort which she put into the show.

## Richmond Hill Plant Suffers \$95,000 Fire Damage

Damage has been estimated at \$95,000 in a fire at General Laminating Corporation Limited, 147 Centre Street East, May 30.

According to Richmond Hill Fire Department, the fire broke out about 12:15 pm when an overhead light on the assembly line near the glue pit, broke and ignited some highly flammable glue, used to laminate some plywood material.

About \$50,000 damage was done to the building, \$30,000 to the laminating machine and \$15,000 to stock.

Richmond Hill Fire Fighters also answered their second call in the past week to a house fire on McConvey Drive, May 29.

The first occurred in a basement bedroom at the home of Ben Hails, 250 McConvey Drive, just seven days after an \$8,000 fire at 253 McConvey Drive.

The fire at the Hails' residence, which was believed to have been caused by spontaneous combustion, was discovered by Mr. Hails' son, who smelled smoke about 3:50 am and woke the rest of the family and called the fire department.

Damage was estimated at \$5,000.

In a fire at Ratcliffs of Canada Limited, 251 Yonge Street North, some long-smouldering dust is believed to have started it all.

Fire Chief Robert Kennedy of Richmond Hill, said that testing had been carried out in a fume duct in the plant during the day and had apparently ignited some dust.

The smouldering dust burst into flame about 6:30 pm and caused some \$6,000 damage before being brought under control.

In Markham, firemen kept a fire from getting out of control at Thornhill Secondary School, Dudley Avenue, May 3 about 12:40 pm, thanks to some people who spotted smoke coming from one of the windows and put in the alarm.

The fire occurred in the chemistry lab and is believed to have resulted from a reaction from some chemicals. Damage was about \$1,500.
