Expenditure ceilings for boards of education will be increased by an average of 7.9 percent next year, Education Minister Thomas

Wells announced recently. The increase, said Wells, is intended to assist boards affected by inflation in providing equal opportunities for all students.

Ceilings have made it necessary for school boards to make hard decisions, said Wells, and the vast majority of boards in the province had managed to keep within the ceilings without lowering standards and quality of education. He said the public has almost without exception supported the principle of keeping increases in educational spending

under control. Special consideration will again be given to boards faced with declining enrolments during 1974, said Wells. The ministry recognizes that such boards are faced with certain fixed costs (for example interest on debentures, maintenance of board property, etc.) which do not decrease when enrolment declines.




