Flawless Performance By Butterflies Cast

Richmond Hill Curtain Club began its new season with a magnificent performance of Leonard Gershe's *Butterflies Are Free*.

Director Gerry Crack has wrung a flawless result from the cast which makes the evening a truly emotional experience.

The play begins with many of the lightweight lines which have made television sitcoms such a wasteland. But not for long.

The author has a wickedly witty pen which the actors exploit with great finesse as the play unfolds in a shabby New York apartment.

Terry Harford gives a superlative performance as the blind Don Baker striking out on his own for the first time in his life.

SURE TOUCH
Effortlessly, he gives a convincing portrayal of a sensitive, intelligent young man who remains unswayed for himself, despite his affliction.

He delivers his witty responses with a sure touch — yet there are dramatic moments when one can swear there are tears glistening in those sightless eyes.

Bonnie Sheppard plays the scatterbrained Jill Tanner whose life and background sharply contrast with those of her blind lover.

With thoughtful abandon, she gives herself easily, and withdraws herself clumsily, causing great pain to her new lover.

Again a great performance. As Don Baker's mother, Pat Kantaroff has some of the best lines in the play and she does not waste a syllable.

While she does not deny she is a middle aged square from wealthy Scarsdale, she shows that not all the witty words and wisdom come from the love-bead generation.

While we resent her interference, initially, we gradually warm to her and develop a grudging respect for her penetrating ripostes. Hers is a great performance.

The part of Ralph Austin, the drama producer who gets Jill to move into his apartment, is a minor one in this play. David Smith makes full use of the limited time he is on the stage and gets the laughs as he outlines the plot of his off-Broadway production.

The set of *Butterflies* is outstanding and an authentic backdrop to the actors.

Not only are there some real Braille books in evidence but the faucets actually work when the players use the kitchen.

GREAT THEATRE
One final masterly touch is shown when the blind man uses his Braille watch. True, only the first three rows might notice that the crystal actually does lift when he tells the time. Yet it is this attention to detail
