## Family Home Evening Mormon Church Plan

### Mrs. Joseph Robinson Dies Her Contributions Many, Varied

Many people in Thornhill, Bucksville and Richmond Hill and surrounding areas are mourning the passing last week of Mrs. Joseph (Helen Isobel) Robinson of Bayview Avenue, Thornhill, who died in York Central Hospital October 2. A woman of many talents, Mrs. Robinson was first of all a farm wife, mother and hostess, but also found time to take an active interest in community and in her church. She was born in Acton but came to the Thornhill area to teach school. She met and married Joseph Robinson and the happy couple and their two sons and two daughter-in-laws celebrated the 31st anniversary of their wedding day last February 14. Through the years in Thornhill, Mrs. Robinson contributed to Holy Trinity Church in many capacities, in women's groups and in the Sunday school. Last year she was president of the ACW and taught in the Sunday school part time. As a farm wife she was also active in the Buttonville Women's Institute, a very active group of women, and served a term as president. She was a tireless worker with the York Central Hospital Auxiliary since its inception two years before the hospital was opened to serve the residents of this area. Her contribution there included a term as president of the auxiliary, president of the region and chairman of the Buttonville Branch. Last year she was presented with a citation for outstanding service to local and regional auxiliaries, the second person to be so honored. The whole community will mourn her and agrees that it is the poorer for her passing.
