**Roman Catholicism 2,000 Year History Of Many Changes**

Catholicism is a concrete phenomenon with a complex way of religious life that has existed for 2,000 years. It is not an abstract idea but a very concrete experience with a long history. Catholicism is always changing always different, Father Dan Donovan told members of York County Roman Catholic School Board and a score of teachers from the local system at the board's November 6 meeting.

Father Donovan, a theology professor at St. Michael's College, University of Toronto, studied in Rome and Germany as well as in Toronto. He was talking about Catholicism and Catholicism and developed his address along the Catholic principle, the distinctive traits of Catholicism, its strength and its weaknesses; Catholicism today, what today brings to historical Catholicism; and some problems of Catholics. Three lines — a few ideas of DIFFERENT TIMES

Referring to St. Augustine and to St. Thomas Aquinas he showed how the church had developed in different ways in different times. He referred to the triumphant counter-reformation of the 16th Century, as well as to other areas to further illustrate the differences.

In the beginning emphasis was placed on the simple teaching of Jesus and the preaching of His disciples about His life. The early Christians weren't too concerned about church buildings, dogma and rituals, he said.

**DEVELOPMENT**  
As the church started to settle down for its long journey into history it had to create a fundamental structure, sort out the fundamental principles to enable it to survive. Thus the church in the second century became quite different from that in the first. During this period came the development of the scriptures, the solidifying of sacramental ritual, the sorting out of the complex leadership of the church with new emphasis on orthodoxy.

This church was a very remarkable creation, according to the speaker, recognizing that if the gospel was to survive in the midst of conflict it must recognize the fact that the principles and dogma were developed to serve and protect the simple gospel message. The role of the bishops and of the Pope was designated with the recognition that church leadership was necessary as a function or service to the gospel message, to protect it from the destructive forces of the world.

**CONSTANT CHANGE**  
He pointed out that Catholicism is open for change — constantly — and that it is not the reality but is to serve reality. He warned of certain inherent dangers — that regular ritual and precise forms of worship can be a help to the individual but can easily slip into ritualism as an end in itself. The problem of Christian truth, to adapt the gospel message in each age, has existed in all ages. It can be abused in verbal orthodoxy — in the belief that certain words are the faith. They are not the faith at all, they are to facilitate the building up of faith.

Part of the Catholic Principles has always been discipline a good thing, giving a sense of continuity. However if misunderstood and degraded it can become an abuse and a source of evil.

**CHURCH-STATE**  
Speaking of Catholicism today, he recalled that in the first three centuries Christians were a minority, were often persecuted and were not accepted in Roman life. In the fourth century this changed and a new era and a new experience in Christianity began when Christians ceased to be the minority and became the majority. Catholicism and culture were one. The church and state worked together and reinforced each other. In Europe there is still great conflict on how to disestablish the church and the state but in Canada with its long history of separation of church and state this problem does not exist.

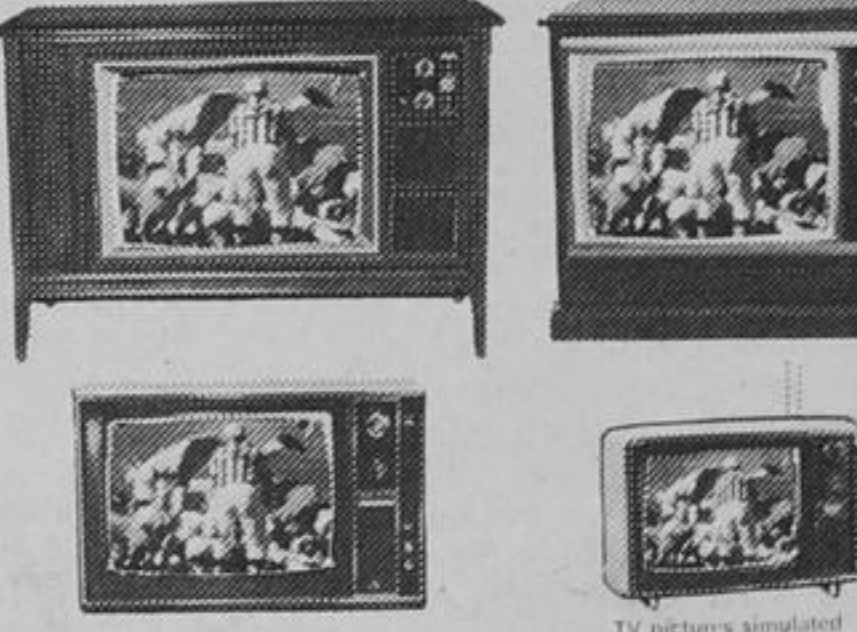
