I won't go down the entire list of players but, it goes without saying, you have to have been formed in September of everyone going out there for you. You're really only as good as your weakest player in the long


> But Coach Brimblecombe seems to have that uncanny ability to get more than most out of everyone and that's the main reason he's been a winner for the past three seasons.






