Van Nostrand's Goal Wins It For Kings

There was little over seven seconds to go in the final 20 minutes Monday night when Larry Van Nostrand popped in the winning goal as the Oak Ridges Kings snapped a loss streak and downed hapless King City 7-6 in a Metro Junior B hockey game at Bond Lake Arena.

It was the King's third win in 17 starts and came on the heels of a shelling Sunday night at the hands of Wexford by 12-1 in Wexford.

Monday's game was strictly a see-saw affair most of the way with King City outshooting Oak Ridges 38-32. Larry Clews played outstanding goal in the twines for the Kings.

The Kings jumped into a 1-0 lead at the 2:19 second mark of the opening period on the first of two goals by Kevin Ross assisted by Roy McQuillin and Larry Guaran.

King City's Ian Young tied it at 11:52 but it was Dave Halpin putting Oak Ridges in front again at 12:56 from Robbie Sackfield and McQuillin.

There was but 49 seconds left when John Lenneville put the Kings in front by 3-1 from Bill Guinane and Gavin Smith.

Oak Ridges moved into a 4-2 lead at 8:41 of the second period courtesy of Terry Legge on a pass from Kim Mabley.

 But the never-say-die crew from King City tied it again


on goals by Young and Jeff Spencer.
