Rams 3, Seneca 3 Hit Open Goal Post

Dave "Digger" Dunkley had the game won for the Richmond Hill Rams Tuesday night with a little over three minutes left in the game. But he couldn't convince a moody goalpost which jumped in front of his shot with a wide-open net staring at him.

Result was a 3-3 tie with a powerful, smooth skating and passing Seneca Ranger squad in a Provincial Junior "A" hockey game at Richmond Hill Arena.

The tie gave the Rangers a share of first place with Vaughan Nationals and elevated the Rams into sole possession of fourth spot one point ahead of North York Rangers, one point behind Aurora Tigers and three from first place. But it all could change. Don't blink your eyes.

HITS GOALPOST
Tuesday night's game was made his move with 3:36 seconds remaining. It started at 3-3 when Dunkley ed when Rick Febbo carried into the corner behind the Seneca net and fired a pass directly in front. Dunkley was standing to one side of the net and flicked the puck toward the open side only to have it rattle off the goalpost.

Despite this piece of bad luck the Rams were reasonably contented to skate away with a tie in a fast-skating game which ranged from end to end.

Both the goalies, Brian Stankiewicz of the Rams and Mike Benny of the Rangers, came up with solid performances on the number of occasions they were tested. Richmond Hill outshot Seneca 31 to 27.

The Rams opened the scoring at 8:56 of the first period on a goal by Defenceman Billy Stephenson from Dave Stuart and Jack Guest.

This lead evaporated quickly as Rick Tarasuk scored at 9:04 and Joe Kelly put the visitors in front at 13:37.

CLEMENT SCORES
The determined Rams kept pecking away in the second period and finally tied the game at 14:25 as Jim Clement was right in front of the net to drive the puck behind Benny on set-ups by Dunkley and Febbo.

Richmond Hill started the Rangers at 5:10 of the final 20 minutes as an always dangerous and opportunistic Hartman scored on assists from Bob Bangay and Ernie Takuuchi.

DEFENSIVE SHELL
The Rams attempted to go into a defensive shell at this point but had trouble discouraging the smooth passing combinations of the Rangers. Seneca got the tying goal at 12:45 and made it look rather easy as Jim Cowley zeroed in on Stankiewicz, swept behind the net and zapped the puck out to Frank Neal who wheeled it home in the same motion. Stankiewicz didn't have a chance.

The Rams play Weston tomorrow night (Friday) at Weston at 8:30 pm and are back home to Vaughan Nationals Tuesday night at 8 pm.
