

Fire Chief Orders Inspection Of Fireplaces After House Fire

Chief Myrl Smith of Markham Fire Department has ordered an inspection of all fireplaces in the Village in the Valley Subdivision in Unionville that may be of the same design as one that caught fire in the Carlton Village area recently.

Chief Smith said he didn't know how many of the 139 houses would have to be inspected. The fire occurred December 13 at the home of Leonard and Wendy Stimson, 59 Chant Crescent. They were awakened about 1:30 am by passers-by who spotted flames on the roof of their year-old house.

FIRST INVESTIGATION
 Chief Smith said that investigation had shown that the fire may have been caused by the construction of the fireplace or chimney. Peter Ruddy, general manager of the development company, said the builders, Bramlea Consolidated Developments Limited, agreed to pay for any changes made resulting from the inspections. The latter will be carried out by the company, Markham Building Department and the masonry subcontractor, who built the fireplaces.

sonry company was "a very reputable firm," and if construction of the fireplace and chimney had contributed to the fire, he was sure it "was an isolated incident."

NOTIFIED HOMEOWNERS
 He said all homeowners were being notified, but the company still didn't know how many homes would be inspected. He said the outside walls of the houses would be opened for inspection so that homeowners wouldn't be inconvenienced during the Christmas holidays.

Fred Fudge, director of Markham Building Department, said it was impossible to inspect every fireplace and chimney, if they were closed in. He said bricklayers building a fireplace didn't have to be licensed, nor did they have to wait for an inspector's approval before closing in a fireplace.

VOLUNTARY CERTIFICATION
 Two years ago the provincial government instituted a voluntary certification program for the fireplace and chimney builders, but no compulsory licensing program is being considered at present.

Hints to the homemakers
MEATS: The principle nutrients in meats are protein, iron and B Vitamin, like Thiamin, Riboflavin, Niacin.
 What do these nutrients do for you?
 • They build and repair body tissue.
 • They help regulate important body processes.
 • They help convert food into energy.
 All meat responds to tender treatment. Even the least tender cut can be delicious and mouth watering with a little extra care.
NOTE: Remember stews are natural born meat extenders—you can count on them to make a bargain into a treat. Any lower cost cut of meat will make a fine stew.
 Make enough; freeze half for another day.

BASIC IDEAS FOR MAKING STEWS
BEEF STEW
 The Meat: Choose beef from the neck, brisket, flank, shank, chuck or heel of the round.
 The Vegetables: 2-3 onions, carrots, turnip, cabbage, green beans, potatoes, celery. Use tomatoes as part of the liquid.
 The Seasonings: Choose your favourites (2-4) Pepper, Worcestershire sauce, green pepper, carrot tops, parsley, celery tops, catsup, vinegar, cloves, basil, garlic, paprika.

SIX WAYS TO SERVE STEW
 1. With plain or potato dumplings.
 2. An excellent Shepherd's Pie—Top the stew with fluffy mashed potatoes.
 3. As a Meat Pie—Top with a tender, flaky pie crust.
 4. With Noodles or Macaroni—serve over noodles instead of using potatoes.
 5. With Potatoes—Don't use potatoes in the stew—serve them on the side boiled or mashed.
 6. With Vegetables—Cook the stew without vegetables and serve them separately.

BEEF AND ONION STEW
 Serves 4
 1 pound beef stew meat, cubed
 1 tablespoon cooking oil
 2 cups boiling water
 1/2 teaspoons lemon juice
 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
 1 small onion, diced
 1 bay leaf
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/2 teaspoon sugar
 1/4 teaspoon garlic salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper
 1/4 teaspoon paprika
 1/2 teaspoon allspice
 4 carrots, quartered
 16 small white onions

• Brown meat in hot oil; add water, lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce, diced onion, bay leaf and seasonings.
 • Cover, simmer 2-hours, stir occasionally.
 • Remove bay leaf; add carrots and onions. Cover; continue cooking 30-minutes or until vegetables are tender.
