Public School BAIF Area
York County Board of Education January 23 approved a staff recommendation to seek building proposal approval in the amount of \$806,500 to the Ministry of Education for a new elementary school in the BAIF Subdivision of Richmond Hill.
On an amendment by Trustee Donald Cousens of Markham, the board agreed also to authorize the staff to take the necessary steps to speed up the building project in an effort to have it completed at an earlier date than January, 1976, the tentative opening date.

Proposed general attendance area for the school would be between Yonge and Bathurst Streets, and between Wedrick Road on the north and Carrville Road on the south.
The first phase is expected to see 1,680 housing units, consisting of single family, semi-detached, quadraxes, townhouses and apartments, with 1,146 elementary school pupils and 569 secondary.

At present, all the single family (85), all the semi-detached (328), all the quadraxes (112), and 62 of the townhouses have been completed and occupied.
It is not expected that any high density apartments from phase 1 will be conducted before 1976.

In 1974 in Phase 2, it is expected that about 50 single family and 98 semi-detached units will be built, plus a possible 346 townhouses and 175 apartments. This leaves two blocks of land for which the ultimate density hasn't been decided, the board said.
Completion of Phase 2 would bring the number of units up to 2,381, with 1,704 elementary pupils and 937 secondary.
