Hill Council Quarrel Parks, Play Regime

An apparent lack of communication between council and its appointed parks and recreation committee came to light at a meeting of council in committee February 11. Committee Chairman Shawn Beggs complained his committee was always the last to be consulted. He made reference to a notice of motion by Councillor Andy Chateauvert that the parks and recreation committee become a committee of council. The new committee would have a membership of five councillors to give council control over expenditures and plans. Chateauvert's proposal is to retain the volunteer members of the committee to make use of their expertise developed over the years. Beggs said the present composition of the committee of seven lay people and two councillors has worked satisfactorily during amalgamation of the parks and recreation committees into one board and in developing a capable parks staff.

NEED DIRECTOR
"We know we need a professional recreation director and want to get a park-oriented, recreation knowledgeable person to take on the position. A person with extensive knowledge of parks is needed because of the enlarged boundaries of this municipality and the facilities we see coming. Unfortunately the man we were going to hire received a better offer from the municipality where he was employed."

"With the acquisition of Sunset Beach we are now into boating, swimming, and camping — things never before handled by our committee. The pressures in the next 10-15 years will be steadily growing and will create a tremendous strain. "As for an overall plan for parks asked for several times by Mrs. Hancey, we do not have one. We are lay people and we need the advice of a professional. This overall plan has to be incorporated into the town's official plan," said Beggs.

WORKING TOGETHER
"I have seen the members of this committee grow and blossom with the town and lose their parochial interests to work together for the benefit of the whole town. I think we have done very well in trying to meet the needs of the whole town with the money made available to us," Mr. Beggs maintained.

Councillor Chateauvert agreed the lay people have contributed much to the town, and have unselfishly devoted their time over the years. "I now recognize what staff has been telling me for some time and that is that this committee should be a council committee to make greater utilization of the staff we have. In view of the magnitude of the budget, one of the largest we have to deal with, I believe council should have a greater control over expenditures."

MONEY SHORTAGE
"We never have all the money we need," replied Mr. Beggs, "but we do have money to spend. All information on the money paid out comes to council. Our minutes are not official until passed by council. I must say that Andy, as a member of the committee, has defied council policies, in fact he has been ready to take on all eight of us. Sure we gripe, but we're directly under control of council. If you think our budget is too large, then you will cut it." Beggs said he asked permission to attend a meeting of senior staff members with Parks and Recreation Director Al White and was refused. "I was told it was for staff only."

\$200,000 FOR BEACH
"When we put out a five year capital forecast, if is not down to the dollar, but the priorities are set out. The \$200,000 to be spent at Sunset Beach includes an overpass over the busy road from the high land to the beach area, a boathouse and community centre stretching out into the lake and a sewage disposal system, etc. We
