**Deed Pond To MTRCA  
Or Lose \$70,000 Grant**

Reconstruction of Richmond Hill's Mill Pond has been under discussion periodically since 1970 when a study was carried out by Canadian Mitchell Associates. This study recommended desilting the Mill Pond, rehabilitation of the dam, and diversion of tributary drainage to reduce silt and nutrient input.

In June 1971 town council requested Metro Conservation Authority to rehabilitate the Mill Pond. Through the Regional Municipality of York the town agreed to be designated the benefitting municipality and assume the municipal share of the cost of the work. The estimated \$140,000 would be eligible for a \$70,000 grant from the province and Richmond Hill would be required to pay the other \$70,000.

**QUESTION OF TITLE**  
Late last fall, the conservation authority received a request from the Ministry of Natural Resources for assurance that the authority will obtain title to the area of the pond and preferably of a buffer strip around the pond; right of access or licence of occupation or similar document giving the authority access to the dam for operation and maintenance; and construction easements adjacent to the pond to permit the work to be carried out and construction easements providing for disposal

areas for the dredged material to be removed from the pond.

Chairman Shawn Beggs of the town's parks and recreation committee said the land dedication was discussed and Otto Whelan, then commissioner of works, negotiated with the conservation authority that they would own the dam and dam site only.

"Then the application was sent to Minister of Resources Leo Bernier and nothing happened for almost two years. The authority has had trouble getting the work into its budget and the former Lands and Forests didn't like where the river is. We got that all straightened out," said Beggs.

**BLOW FROM NOWHERE**  
Then out of nowhere comes this letter from A. D. Latorell, director of the Conservation Authorities Branch of the Ministry of Natural Resources Works Commissioner Bernard Toprowski has been negotiating with the authority, too, to make provision for widening Mill Street when the dam is reconstructed. If the government won't give the grant through the conservation authority we can still go ahead under the Parks Assistance Act, but we were saving that grant for further development in the park area," he said.

"I understand these land dedications are required by legislation in order for the province to provide the

50%," reported Regional Councillor Lois Hancey. "Regardless of who owns the land, the pond isn't going to move."

Parks and Recreation Committee Member Russell Tilt confirmed Mrs. Hancey's statement. "It is in the legislation. The conservation authority does have to have title to the land. In some cases this title is just for the flooded areas. The authority knew when it went into the discussion with Richmond Hill that the grants would not be paid unless it held title to the land to the water's edge."

"Do they have title to Fairy Lake in Newmarket?" asked Mr. Beggs. And the answer he got was yes.

**NO HILL JEOPARDY**  
"I can see no jeopardy involved to Richmond Hill in having the water, dam and easements in the hands of the authority. There are thousands of acres in the Metro area on this basis and I haven't come up with one instance where there has been any difficulty," said Mrs. Hancey.

"Our money is in the budget, the authority's money is in the budget. I suggest we have a joint meeting of council, parks and recreation committee, members of the authority executive and appropriate members of the Ministry of Natural Resources to discuss the Mill Pond rehabilitation, and council agreed unanimously," she said.

**RC Separate School Board

Heading the education committee will be John Taylor with Mrs. Noreen Lee, Eugene Jacobs, Gus Clarke and Rev. Father Francis Robinson as the members. Malcolm Peake will chair the facilities committee composed of John O'Mahoney, Gus Clarke, Frank Bescoe and Leo Wigglesworth.

The bylaw and policy committee will be chaired by Alex MacGregor, with members being Eugene Jacobs, Richard McIsaac and Frank McElroy.

Members of the budget committee will be Eugene Jacobs, chairman; John Taylor, Malcolm Peake, John O'Mahoney and Leo Wigglesworth.

**SALARY NEGOTIATIONS**  
Conducting salary negotiations will be a committee of

Ivan St. John, Frank McElroy and John O'Mahony as chairman.

Mrs. Noreen Lee heads the liaison and public relations committee which has as members Richard McIsaac, Frank Bescoe, Ivan St. John and Malcolm Peake.

Father Robinson is the chairman of the religious education and family life committee of which Mrs. Lee, Alex MacGregor and John Taylor are members.

**NEW PROGRAMS**  
Chairman McDermott noted that in the coming year the trustees will be called on to develop and expand the programs which have been initiated in the areas of curriculum planning and plant development and expansion. He said these two very broad areas will need continuing and active trustee input and decision as the year progresses.

He also said the very informative presentations which have been made on a regular basis at board meetings relative to all areas of educational development in the Roman Catholic school system will be continued throughout this year.

**Vaughan Finally Gets Okay To  
Rezone For First Funeral Home**

People are dying to get into a funeral home proposed for the Thornhill area in Vaughan. But it's not all that easy.

In fact, York Regional Council last week at first turned down a planning committee recommendation that would have approved an amendment to the Vaughan Official Plan to allow a funeral home on the north side of Steeles Avenue, mid-way between Bathurst and Yonge Streets.

The recommendation had also called for approval of Dr. Owen Slingerland, commissioner of health and social services, because of the lack of water and sewer services.

**SOIL IS BAD**  
Dr. Slingerland said soil conditions in the area were poor for septic tank and tile bed disposal systems. So a non-conventional type of bed, requiring a large area of land, special pump and distribution systems, has to be installed.

Negotiations were currently proceeding with Metro and the ministry of the environment. These indicated water and sewer facilities would be available in 1975 or sooner.

Said Councillor Jack Gilbert of Vaughan: "We have a heck of a time getting anything done up here. We can't even get a funeral home. People are dying all the time."

Gilbert said approval was received from the health unit when the application was first processed, but not when it came up again through the region.

**AND NOW WHAT?**  
When the recommendation for approval was lost, Gilbert brought it up again under new business. He asked the amendment be approved. Council agreed this time, minus the approval of the health officer.

Said Mayor Evelyn Buck of Aurora: "Should we be preparing an argument against the medical health officer? He turned it down."
