**Beat The Drum Slowly For Vaughan Firefighter**

More than 400 firefighters from York Region and Metro attended the funeral of Leslie (Chic) Milne, 42, of 15 Clemson Crescent, Maple, a member of Vaughan Fire Department, who died shortly after attending a fire February 2 in the Thornhill area of Vaughan. Mr. Milne was stricken by a heart attack at a house fire while laying hose lines for

search and rescue procedure. Chief James Davidson said Milne complained of chest pains about three minutes after arriving on the scene. He was taken to York Central Hospital and died early the next morning. His coffin was transported on a fire truck from Maple United Church to Maple Cemetery in a snowstorm.

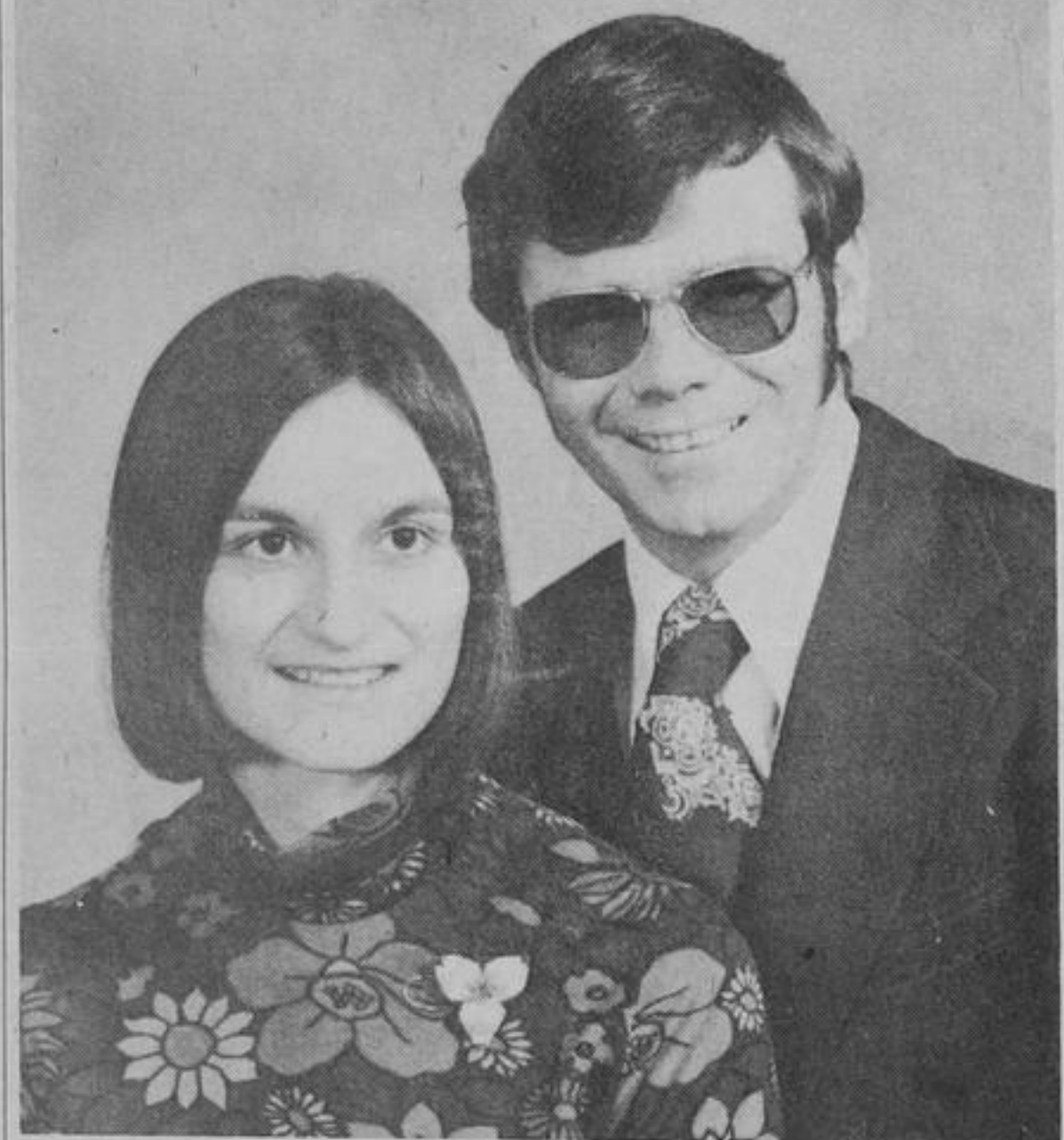
