Maple Dump Park Plan

A draft plan to eventually turn 100 acres of land at the site of Vaughan Town's sanitary landfill site just north of Maple into a summer passive recreational area was approved by council February 18.

The general area includes a 46 acre site purchased by the town in 1968 to the east of the existing town land fill site and a further 43 acres added from Disposal Service Limited to the west in 1972.

The plan was prepared by the firm of Johnson, Sustrom, Weinstein and Associates Ltd., Landscape Architects who were hired October 1, 1973. Emphasis of the plan is for summer passive recreational purposes with two small ponds, walking trails and picnic facilities through the wooded portions concentrated within the eastern section of the land. The west portion is mainly designed for a "look-out" connected by a road from Teston Road to the top of the hill. This hill is also connected by trails to the remaining lands.

The consultants stated in their report what while "the plan allows for skiing facilities superior to any in the area this type of use might not be warranted due to the large expense for the installation of tows, snow-making equipment and wells for additional water supply."

Council in a works committee report pointed out that "since the south and west slopes of the hill are complete the works department is now in a position to commence the final cover and tree planting operations."

"The south slope was seeded last fall and trucks are presently hauling top soil to the higher portion and west slope. In summary, the west, south and top portions of the hill will be completed with grass and trees by next fall. "The construction of the trails and ponds in the eastern portion of the site can commence this year since this area was never intended for the use of a land-filled site."

Council indicated that it wasn't anticipated to have any of these facilities open to the public "until 1975 to allow a growth period for the plantings. With the present rate of filling it is expected that the total site will be complete in 1978-1979."

"The improvement to an area of this size and magnitude will never cease and changes to the plan will occur as new ideas and concepts are initiated. However, the various departments involved can use the plan as a guide to realize where the top soil should be placed and where the trees should be planted."

NEWMARKET: A predicted 70% price increase for sod in 1974 will add \$300 to the cost of new homes in York Region and Metro, builders say. The new price will be 33 cents a yard in the field plus 10c for delivery. The 1973 price was 20 cents a yard in the field plus eight cents for delivery. Many sod farms are located between Richmond Hill and Keswick. The builder will also face increased labor cost for laying the sods and for topsoil if needed. The cost of the average lawn, about 1,000 square yards last year was between \$450 and \$500. This year it will be between \$750 and \$800.
