## VAUGHAN HYDRO NOTICE OF CHANGE OF RATES EFFECTIVE MAY 1, 1974

As a result of continuing increases in the cost of materials, services, and labour, the Hydro-Electric Commission of the Township of Vaughan has applied for, and received, approval of Ontario Hydro for an increase in retail rates. The new rates will be about 5% higher than those now in force, and will be applied on bills rendered on or after May 1, 1974. A typical residential bill on old rates, and on new rates is shown, for a normal two-month period, where average energy used is 1200 KWH.
