ONTARIO'S NEW TAX CREDIT SYSTEM:

2 out of 3 Ontario residents who file income tax returns this year will share \$300 million in tax credits.

(Even if they don't pay income tax!)

Families, pensioners, roomers, boarders, the handicapped and others will benefit. Ontario's new Tax Credit System provides for three separate credits, and here's how they work:

1. People who own or rent (including roomers and boarders) may share in the Property Tax Credit.

2. People who fill out a Federal income tax return may share in the Sales Tax Credit.

3. People over 65 may share in the Pensioner Tax Credit.

You must fill out a Federal income tax return.

The new purple Ontario Tax Credit Form comes attached inside it. So even if you don't pay income tax, you should still file a Federal income tax return with the Ontario Tax Credit Form this year.

We want you to get your fair share of Ontario's tax credits.


