Parents and high school students from southern York Region gathered here Friday morning at Richmond Heights Centre to board buses in a protest cavalcade. Organized by Rev. Charles Edwards of St. James Anglican Church, Sutton, the first buses started from the northern part of the region

and travelled down Yonge Street to the provincial government centre at Queen's Park in Metro. More buses joined the cavalcade as it travelled south. (See news story on the Queen's Park protest on Page 3.)

School Strike Protestors Board Buses

Over five hundred people from all over York Region took part in a demonstration march at Queen's Park last Friday, with the purpose of bringing the York teachers' strike quickly to a close.

Carrying signs, and, in some cases, balloons, the Richmond Hill demonstrators boarded a bus at the Richmond Heights Centre, where they were joined by other buses from Sutton, Aurora, and Unionville.

Organizer Mrs. Dorene Trunk of 267 Gretel Drive, handed out letters which stated the agenda for the day, and advised the demonstrators to act maturely and responsibly. Many people used the back of these letters to write to Education Minister Thomas Wells.

his power to see that the students were back in school at the earliest possible date.

A small delegation of organizers then accompanied Mr. Wells into the Legislative Buildings to discuss the strike situation with Ontario Premier William Davis.

York Centre MLA Donald Deacon then addressed the crowd, urging that a requisition be signed by 20% of the registered voters, calling for a new election of trustees.

A New Democratic Party representative, spoke next. He stated that the trustees had failed to negotiate pro-

perly, and added that teachers should definitely have a say in the contentious matter of pupil teacher ratio.

The weather being quite cold, the marchers went inside the lobby of the Legislative Buildings to wait for news of the talk.

An hour later, Rev. Charles Edwards of Sutton informed the demonstrators that the delegation had made it clear to Premier Davis that they felt government intervention was absolutely essential at this point.

Rev. Edwards urged the demonstrators to increase public pressure, as the delegation had failed to convince

the provincial government to act immediately to impose compulsory arbitration to settle the dispute. He advocated the signing of Donald Deacon's petition and proposed a plan whereby concerned parents should begin

registering their children on masse in a number of Toronto area schools, starting March 11. Some of the schools suggested included Agincourt High School, Lawrence Park Collegiate, and Forest Hills Collegiate.

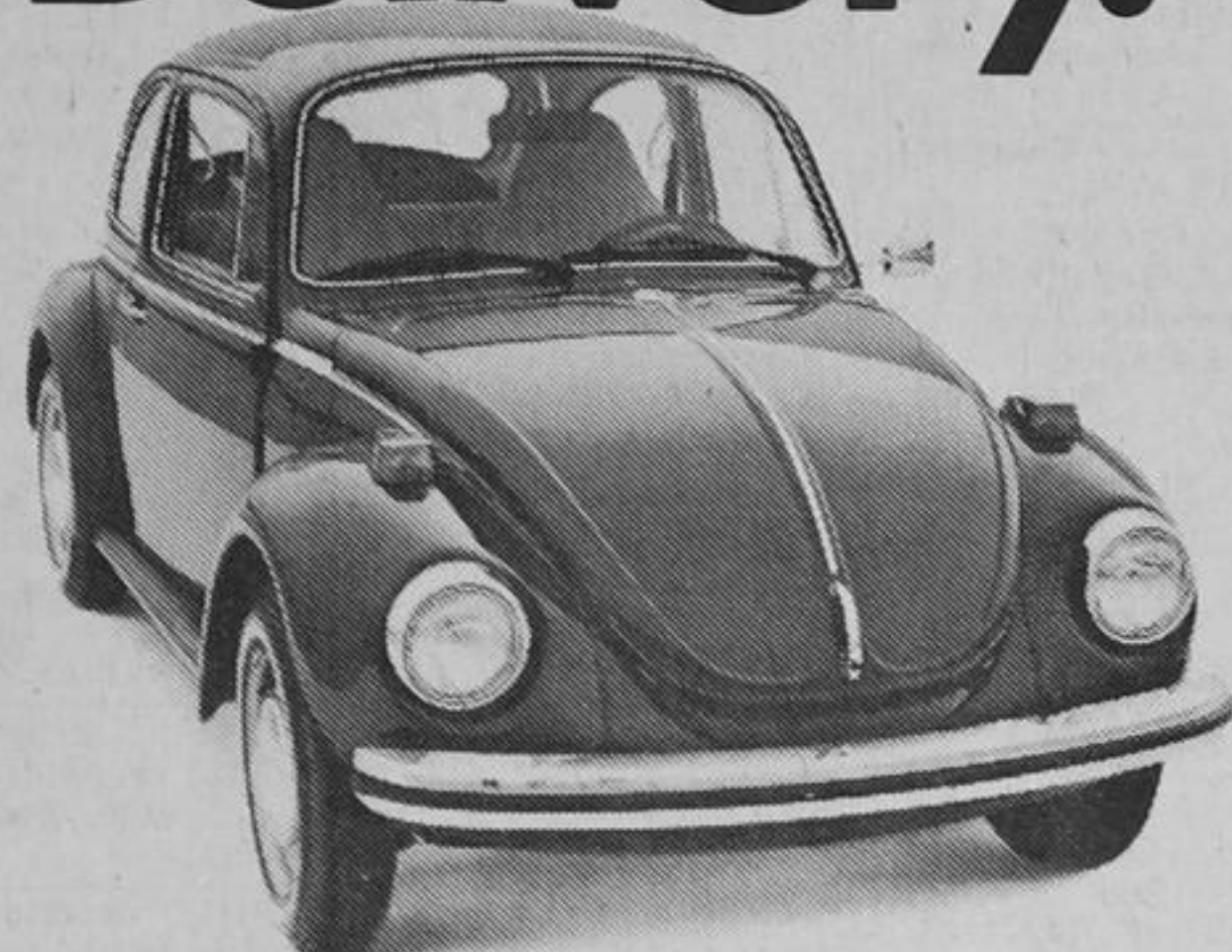

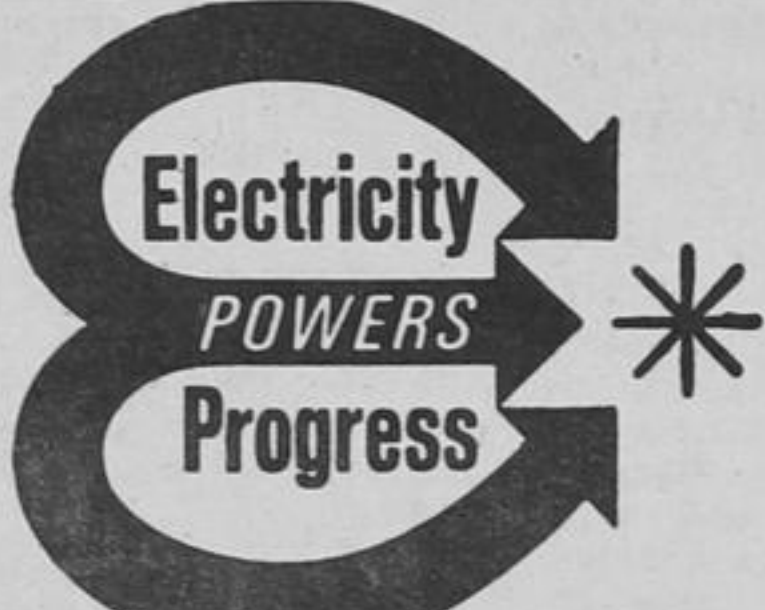
