Study Condominium At Two-Day Seminar Sponsored By Seneca

A two-day seminar "Condominiums: Concepts and Challenges" will be held at the Inn on the Park on March 27 and March 28, sponsored by the Conference Seminar Centre of Seneca College.

At the seminar there will be a comprehensive look at condominiums, their establishment, evolution, public acceptance, financing, marketing, development and construction as a viable alternative to the landlord-tenant relationship.

While the single-family house is not yet a luxury of the past, the condominium unit is firmly being established as its future alternative. Indeed, the same principles inherent in condominium development of apartments, townhouses, and stacked row houses are now being used to plan and finance industrial complexes, plazas, and even cemeteries.

Condominium apartments and townhouses are continuing to take a bigger share of the real estate market. Condominium units accounted for 17 percent of the residential units sold through the Multiple Listing Service of the Toronto Real Estate Board in January. The average price was \$33,240 for condominium apartments and townhouses compared with \$30,161 a year earlier.

Experts predict that the condominium market in its many innovative stylings such as townhouses, stacked townhouses and middle density accommodation will be dominant in 1974.

Previously, condominiums have been developed on the basic principle that the owners purchase space, but land is held or leased by the group as a whole. Operating costs are shared proportionately.

With recent trends where ownership of space is effected by the element of time, owners can share condominium space in terms of months rather than years as evidenced by vacation area developments in Florida and Europe.

As a seminar, "Condominiums: Concepts and Challenges," will appear largely to career persons in finance, land development, construction, appraisal, architecture, real estate marketing, law, mortgaging, municipal planning, accounting and engineering who will be working either directly or indirectly with housing in general and condominiums in particular.

There will be special speakers and condominium authorities, plenary sessions on key topic areas and panel discussions directed by outstanding leaders in business.

Some of the topics and speakers are: Legal Aspects of Condominiums — Alvin Rosenberg, Condominium Interrelationships — Roderick MacLeod, Financing and Re-financing Condominiums — Alan Purdy, Future Direction in Condominium Development — David Clurman.

Among panel participants will be: Dennis Kroul, Robert Radford, Hartley Roberts, Morton Smith, Dennis Barker, Robert Davies, Paul Hellen, Edward Hughes, Al Wyand, James Galbraith.

Dr. James Gillies, MP Don Mills, will give a major policy address on proposals for land development and housing in Canada.

As the program develops other speakers and topics will be added.

It is anticipated that this seminar will receive regular media coverage in addition to special TV attention for highlights.

A seminar fee of \$95, will cover attendance at sessions, luncheons, social hours, end-of-day reception, and program materials.

All "Condominiums: Concepts and Challenges" plenary sessions will be provided with typewritten transcripts of the proceedings following the seminar.

Additionally, as a special convenience for seminar delegates, information service centres will be available for consultation. These will be sponsored by financial, legal, mortgage, government and other institutions represented at the seminar.

Since attendance will be limited and applications will be processed as they are received, delegates are urged to register early.

"Condominiums: Concepts and Challenges" will provide a unique comprehensive "crash" course in this future housing trend.

Anglican Youth "Care" Group

30 Young People Attempt To Find Meaning Of Life

More than 30 young people from five different parishes around Metro assembled at St. Mary's Anglican Church, Richmond Hill, March 1 to 3 for the second of three weekends planned by the Toronto Diocesan youth "care" group which has been organized to assist youth groups within the Diocese.

The group headed by Anne Elliot was skilled in music, among other things, and the theme of the weekend was a "Journey"—a journey "In Search of Oneself: Who Am I?" "In Search of Christ: Why Am I?" "In Search of Community: Where Am I?"

Representatives came from St. Mary's and St. Gabriel's in Richmond Hill, All Saints' in Toronto, St. Philip's in Etobicoke and St. James The Apostle in Brampton.

With the assistance of St. Mary's Rev. Don Downer the young people stashed their bedrolls and other essentials, unpacked their musical instruments, and entered on the first phase of their study:

On Saturday evening, March 2, they relaxed and worked on developing their own sense of community as they listened to music, talked informally and ate pizza.

Sunday morning the group participated and provided a musical lead in the contemporary Eucharistic Worship Service in the chapel at St. Mary's.

After the service they collected their bedrolls, their belongings, said "good-bye" to many new friends and all went home.

Church Arrest Case Is Closed

The case of the wedding arrest at Trinity United Church, Newmarket was officially closed Tuesday night of last week by members of the York Regional Police Commission.

Commissioner Ray Twiney told the board that a copy of Chief Bruce Crawford's report on the incident had been mailed to Reverend Bruce Sutor with an invitation for further comments from him.

Mr. Twiney said he had "received no reply from Mr. Sutor and I can only assume the matter has been dealt with to his satisfaction."

It was at the commission's previous meeting that Chief Crawford presented a report following a complaint by Mr. Sutor. It resulted from the arrest of Wayne Taylor, 21, and Arthur Burgin, 23, both of Willowdale, just outside the church after they had both been married in a double wedding ceremony.

Mr. Sutor had objected to the fact three plain clothesmen entered the church during a religious ceremony, sat there while the ceremony was going on and then apprehended the principals outside afterwards.

In a written report, Chief Crawford denied the men had sat through the service and stated that the arrest had been made in a "perfectly legal and dignified manner with no criticism to be directed at the officers concerned."

Bruce's Mill Maple Syrup Starts Mar. 16

Find out how that "table favorite" fresh maple syrup is produced.

Come out to Bruce's Mill Conservation Area weekends and holidays from March 16 to April 24. For the seventh consecutive year, Bruce's Mill will be the site for one of the few remaining maple syrup operations still open to the public. The demonstrations are sponsored by Metro Conservation Authority.

See demonstrations of the old and the new methods of syrup making, from sap bubbling in a big iron kettle over a wood fire to plastic tubes, vacuum pumps and other apparatus associated with contemporary production. It's an enjoyable outing for the entire family and especially for youngsters during the mid-winter break (March 16 to March 24 inclusive). Top off the day with a visit to the cook stove to sample the hot pancakes offered for sale.

Beginning the weekend of March 16 and continuing through on consecutive weekends to April 14 there will be public demonstrations between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., weather permitting.

In addition, daily demonstrations will be held during the winter school break. Regular parking charges (\$1.50 per car) apply.
