Toronto Presbytery. Miss Finson spoke of her life and work with people with different backgrounds to her own - those who thought beer drinking was a recreation, overburdened young mothers, street walkers, etc. Eventually her work turned mainly to teens and drop-in centres.

She mentioned the slow stubborn rituals of the church institution, but people do change, and so the institution changes. Jesus was a community social worker, she said. He worked with people on the outside of the mainstream. Social services all started with workers of the church, said Miss Finson, and she feels the church's purpose is to serve the

people to help themselves. The time will come, she said, when the people of the church will not be satisfied to give a toy to the poor or send sandwiches to hungry men. They will ask. "Why do we have the poor, and why are these men hungry?"

Turning to the women's work in the church. Miss Finson said it is not recognized enough or named. It is important work, demanding and exciting. If women are interested in a project it will be carried out.
