

Seven Goals Pat Lohman Hill Girls Win Hockey Title

Pat Lohman was a one-girl battering ram for the champion Richmond Hill Gormley Sand and Gravel team against Sharon.

She scored no less than seven goals as the local girls romped to a two straight best-of-three win over Sharon.

The two straight wins by 6-1 and 5-3 scores brought the league championship to the Ron McAndrews coached team in its first year of operation.

"You have to pay credit to Pat," observed Coach McAndrews, "when you consider she scored seven of our total of 11 goals."

That wind-up 5-3 game Tuesday of last week at Sharon saw the Gormley girls taking a 2-0 lead in the first period on a goal by Debby Jones from Jan Baxter followed by another one by Lohm from Baxter and Jones.

Sharon made it 2-1 on Sharon Daiken's goal.

The opening game in Richmond Hill March 14 was a romp all the way for Lohman as she fired home five of the six goals scored by Richmond Hill. The other one went to Brenda Buchan.

Richmond Hill led 2-0 at the end of the first and 5-1 going into the last 20 minutes.

The Hill girls won their league title also and throughout their first season compiled a fantastic win-loss record of 26, 1, and 3.
