Hill Juveniles Win Welland Tournament

Minor Bantams
The Richmond Hill Tournaments Incorporated Minor Bantam "A" team rapped in four straight goals Sunday in the third period to down Chatham 6-3 in the first game of their best-of-five OMHA finals in Chatham.

Danny Girard was the big gun for the Tournaments squad firing home three goals as his teammates came from behind a 3-2 deficit in the final period in a fast-skating contest.

Richmond Hill got into the finals by ousting Kingston 6-3 and 7-3 last week to win their best-of-five series in four games.

Buttressing the three goals by Girard were singles by Stephen Bowers, Phil Wood, and Jamie Gropp. Frank Nigro came up with a fine effort drawing four assists with two going to Jerry Leger and singles to Gary Gentry, Blair Lewis, and Girard.

Steve Price played an outstanding game in goal for the winners.

Both teams were slated to play their second game in Richmond Hill Wednesday night of this week at 7:30 pm with the third game back in Chatham Friday night. If a fourth game is necessary it will be played in Richmond Hill Sunday.

The Tournaments squad got into the finals by upending Kingston 6-3 Tuesday night and then putting the finishing touches by whacking them 7-3 in Richmond Hill Friday night.

Friday's game saw Phil Wood, Chris Nye and Frank Nigro blasting home two goals apiece with the other one going to Jamie Gropp. Girard picked up two assists with the others going to Ray Roberts, Blair Lewis, Frank Nigro, Steve Bowers and Peter Haliday.

Thornlea's Dianne Diggins Returns To Form After Injury

Markham Ealanor Mahal proved she is the country's top sprinter under 20 years of age when she won the 50 metre and 400 metre events with Indoor High School championships recently.

Second in both events was Thornlea's Dianne Diggins who was returning to active competition after a serious achilles tendon injury in 1973.

Mahal recorded an impressive 58.9 seconds in the 400 metres to register a new record for that event in high school competition.

To prove that her ankle is well on the way to mending, Diggins won the long jump competition with a leap of 16'10". Two other leaps in the 18 feet category were disallowed.

Young Rick Carton, of Bayview Secondary School, showed that his winter training was worth the effort when he recorded a 4:19.5 time in the 1500 metres. At present there appears no competitor for Rick in the junior school categories over 1500 metres.

A surprise performance was turned in by Midget Jeff Bells of Richmond Hill High School who placed second, by a whisker, in the 400 metres and third in the 50 metres.

Other athletes who performed well at this meet were Bruce Cook, Marnee Buckles, Carrie Collett and Bill Milley. Shot Putter Bill Milley had quite a busy week winning the Inter-Borough competition a week Saturday with a toss of 43', 10", the high school meet with a throw of 49', 18" and placed second in the Ontario championships for under-20 athletes with a toss of 46', 10".

Big Bill rates as one of the best shot putt competitors in Ontario and with his win in the Ontario championships retains a place on the Ontario Junior Track and Field team. Bill is in his final year at Woodbridge High School.

A brief summary of school competitors who recorded good times last Wednesday shows Ealanor Mahal of Markham winning in the 50 metres in 6.7 seconds and the 400 metres in 58.9 seconds.

Thornlea had Dianne Diggins winning the long jump and placing second in the 50 metres and 400. Carrie Collett, a Midget, took second place for Thornlea in the 50 metre hurdles with a time of 9.0 seconds.
