Although modern methods of production, storage and marketing mean that Canadians can enjoy a wide variety of vegetables and fruits at any time of the year, there is something special about the arrival of Ontario-grown hothouse and garden produce. Ontario-grown produce adds incomparable flavour and colour to every meal.

Did you know that in many fruits and vegetables, the majority of vitamins and minerals are stored just beneath the skin? To get the best food value, prepare vegetables in their 'jackets' or skins when possible. Eat fruit and vegetables raw frequently. Since the vitamins are close to the surface, cook vegetables auickly in a small amount of boiling water, just until barely tender. This will preserve as much of the natural vitamin content of the vegetable as possible, When done, the vegetable should be tender but still have some 'crunch' or bite. Plan meal preparation so that the vegetables will be tender just at the moment the meal is ready to serve.
