## Hospital Wing Cornerstone

"Streaker" show two fads of the time. A plastic garbage bag, illustrates the method of waste disposal in 1974 and the widespread use of plastics, which may be obsolete years from now.

## INCURABLE DISEASES

There is information on pollution problems, the energy crisis and photos of wide open spaces and country scenes, maps of York Region showing towns, highways and population. Newspaper articles and a list of diseases for which there is now no cure — the common cold, cancer, rabies, leukemia, and sickle-cell disease are also included.

In addition to the students' contribution, the committee preparing for the official ceremony expects to include newspapers from the municipalities served by the hospital, Centennial Flags from Richmond Hill (1973) and Markham (1972), a hospital brochure and a copy of the annual report of York Central Hospital from 1973.

Also to be enclosed in the cornerstone will be a video tape of the cornerstone laying ceremony, clippings describing various fads of the 20th Century such as gold-fish swallowing, telephone booth packing, etc.

Pictures of the area taken from the roof of the hospital and from a helicopter will be included, as well as a contemporary medical textbook, the Imperial measuring system and a ruler showing inches, both of which will soon be replaced by the metric system of measure. Finally there will be a ticket on the first \$1,000,000 lottery in Canada.

## BUDGET SKYROCKETS

The cornerstone laying heralds a period of growth which has taken the hospital from its opening to the future. It is anticipated that within the year the hospital staff will increase from 375 people to about 1,000. The operating budget of today, \$3,300,000, will grow to about \$10,000,000, of which some three-quarters will represent salaries.

There are at present 77 members on the medical staff and 17 dentists. There are 100 nurses, just 12 pediatric beds, and no in-patient psychiatric facilities. Personnel and services will be vastly increased with the opening of the new wing.

Although there has been considerable staff turn-over in the past ten years, at a recent staff dinner, 27 employees were honored with five-year pins and 16 with life-year pins. In 1973 the hospital served 584 in-patients, performed 3,300 operations and handled 1,675 patients in the emergency department. While the previous years had shown a downward trend in births, in 1973 there was an increase of 57 births, a total of 700 births at York Central.

## VOLUNTEERS INDISPENSIBLE

Through the years, volunteers have performed an indispensable service in and for the hospital. The auxiliary has 12 branches in Southern York and 564 members. One branch, the junior auxiliary, has 131 members who last year contributed more than 5,396 hours of service.

The various branches sponsor many functions in addition to the hours in service in the hospital, raising funds through teas, bridge and euchre parties, fashion shows, bake sales, auctions, luncheons, and the annual White Rose Ball.

Members have assisted in taking inventory at local stores, quilted, rolled bandages, handcrafted gifts for the hospital gift shop, and through collection of Dominion Store tapes, have raised considerable monies to help meet the needs of the hospital.

Through walkathons, lotteries and other means, the hospital is currently attempting to raise \$1 million over a five-year period to help equip the new wing and refurbish the existing hospital. To date donations and pledges of more than \$250,000 have been received.

## YOUTH BAND TO PLAY

The ceremony Sunday will begin with the playing of "O Canada" by the Richmond Hill Youth Concert Band followed by the invocation by Rev. Dana Lamb of St. John's Baptist Church, Richmond Hill.

Guests will be welcomed by Sam Cook, chairman of the board of trustees, and there will be presentations of cheques from walkathons sponsored by Crosby Heights Senior School, Richmond Hill, and the Richmond Hill Progress Club.

There will be musical selections played by the Youth Concert Band led by Music Director Bob Thiel, and the band's Past-Chairman Mrs. Grace Jackson will introduce Dr. James Langstaff, who will officiate at the unveiling of the stone. Refreshments will be served following the ceremony.
