## Corn Dryer Legal Farm Use

(Continued from page 1)

Lloyd Doner. Councillor Andy Chateauvert reported he had visited Mr. Baker and was of the opinion that at that time that Mr. Baker was convinced that the use was a legal one and that his concern now was about the noise and enforcement of the town's anti-noise bylaw. "Based on our solicitor's comments, I believe it is a legal use." He noted that Mr. Doner did not have to sign a site plan agreement but was willing to do so, "which is to his credit. It will provide some protection to Mr. Baker and other neighbors. We must uphold the laws of this municipality. If the law is wrong, then we should change the law."

## STANDARDS COMING

Solicitor Fraser reported that he had been informed that the Ministry of Energy and Resources has drafted standards of permissible noises, a process which has taken some time. It is now complete and will be published in the near future. It is expected it will be in effect before the end of the year. He pointed out the importance of this to Mr. Doner, who may find that his installation contravenes these standards.

In answer to a question from Regional Councillor Lois Hancey as to why this location was chosen for the dryer, Mr. Doner replied "accessibility to the road and hydro limitations (only 220 volt not 550 volt). We didn't want it around Gormley because of the children. Behind the present bins, which are on fill, is a creek and swampy area which separates it from the rest of the farm. In placing the operation there we felt we were destroying the least possible agricultural land. The Doners have never disregarded our neighbors and never will, but we didn't anticipate any problem with Mr. Baker."

"What would it cost to move the installation?" asked Mrs. Hancey. "In the area of \$10,000 to \$15,000," was the answer. "I intend to put up one additional storage building and one hopper bin to accommodate slightly more grain than last year, all raised on our own farms. We processed the same amount last year even if we didn't store it all. We will put in a different dryer which will operate about twice as fast and the conveyors will be mostly replaced."

intermittent noise, but the new equipment will eliminate most of that and the plywood does considerably decrease the noise."

## RAN 21 NIGHTS

"Would you be amenable to stopping the dryer at sunset?" was Mrs. Hancey's next question. "Last year I operated only 21 nights. With the new equipment we are hoping we will be able to reduce the number of hours of operation, but I can't bind myself. It hasn't run at all since November and ran in the day times when necessary, but not every day. Sometimes we had to run all night, because the grain could heat up overnight and be spoiled, and then wouldn't have to run in the daytime. I can understand that this could have been aggravating to Mr. Baker, but it was necessary. We have another neighbor, living closer to the dryer than Mr. Baker, and we have had no complaints from him. My father lives closer and he hasn't complained."

The town policy in rural areas as contained in the official plan was quoted by Planning Director Hesse Rimon as "the production of a rural area should be preserved and urban growth should in no way prevent that." From a planning point of view, he pointed out that being so close to Metro we will have more and more conflict between city dwellers who come to live in the country and farmers who are trying to earn their living from the land. "Farms in Ontario are diminishing at an alarming rate, partly because of this kind of problem. The farmer cannot afford land values such as are usual in industrial areas, he cannot afford to haul his produce into an industrial area for processing."
