The extremely large task of co-ordinating such a tour has been undertaken by Mrs. Robert Silcox and Mrs. Michael Sifton. With their experience from past tours, things are sure to run smoothly.

### MAPLE BUILDER

Located on the 16th Sideroad, high on a hill, this modern home looks through high cathedral ceilings onto small valleys on all sides. Built four years ago by Des Bourke of Maple, much use was made of ancient beams and barn wood. These act as a foil for the many pieces of Canadiana and the items of Spanish and Mexican origin.

John Ball is the chief librarian at Scarborough College of the University of Toronto and Gillian is well known as a dramatist involved in Theatre Aurora productions. They are parents of Philippa and Christopher and at present family pets include a goat, three dogs, a mouse, guinea pigs and an unclaimed budgerigar.

Be sure to notice the lovely pool bed in Philippa's

room and the old cradle beside the fireplace. Ascent to the loft by way of a ship's ladder will only be attempted by a few daring souls, I'm sure.

One advantage to living on a hill, besides the cooling summer breezes, is the winter skiing right outside your door.

### CONCESSION 3 HOME

Other homes on the tour include "Owlsdale", home and office of veterinarian Dr. and Mrs. Anthony Calverley on Concession 3. This many-levelled house with its portraits of Calverleys from the 15th Century and its play rooms of all kinds, illustrates every aspect of family life. Birds and animals too are welcomed to cedar woods and rambling ponds which offer sanctuary to all wild life. Mrs. Calverley is also a member of Kingcraft House.

Number four is the home of Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Carmichael. Mr. Carmichael is the president of Firth, Brown Steels Company Limited. Surrounded by the birch woods of King Summit, this very individual house is located on Jane Street and was designed by architect Denis Bowman. It shows imaginative use of wood and fabric textures in the interior decor, and of small sunken areas off the living room and master bedroom.

### OLD FARMHOUSE

Number five, "Fiddlehead Farm", is the weekend residence of Gerald and Margaret Godsoe situated on King Sideroad between King City and Nobleton. Gerald Godsoe QC, is the Chairman of Newconex Holdings Limited. Their 150-year-old farm house has had additions built on to form a delightful setting for antiques from the Maritimes, Quebec and Ontario. The property slopes

to an artificial lake and has a wide-spreading view of farmlands.

The Kingscross residence of Kurt and Joy Larsen is listed next on the tour. Kurt

Larsen is president of Blue Giant Equipment Company Limited, Brampton. Mrs. Larsen is the co-owner of the Colour and Contrast Shop on King Sideroad and also of the newly opened Pheasant's Feather in Snowball Village.

Their home is one of the original houses in the picturesque Kingscross Estates. With its wide pool and sun deck it is an invitation to indoor-outdoor living. Beautiful objects from travels around the world enliven the interior. The Larsens have three children.

Mr. and Mrs. Phil Sherwood live on Sherwood Farm, in a Georgian stone house with its beautiful view. Interest centres on the barn and paddocks, the well-known breeding establishment of thoroughbred racehorses.

Almoner, the 1971 Queen's Plate winner was bred here, as well as Good Old Mort and Grey Whiz. A bright hope for the future is Solar Path, now in training. Mrs. Sherwood is a member of the York Central Hospital Auxiliary and is on the board of Blue Hills Academy.

### STOP FOR LUNCH

If not before, I'm sure everyone will stop now for lunch at the King Ski Centre, a beautiful country club in forest setting with stream and picturesque bridges. Here you will find treasures and trivia, collectors corner, dried and live flowers,

handicrafts, books and sherry. The book stall is a special effort this year.

Luncheon consisting of assorted sandwiches, cole slaw, cookies and tea or coffee will be served here for \$1. Luncheon tickets are available when you order your tickets or on the day of the tour.

On to Morning Hill, home of Allan and Fran Wilson. This is the newest home on the tour and much of the interior design was done by Mrs. Wilson. The unexpected meets one everywhere in this Norman French mansion with its free-standing tower and arches and fireplaces of century-old brick. Very original decor in the games rooms and bar is rivalled by a bathroom that suggests both a greenhouse and a chapel.

OUTDOOR SCULPTURE Last on our list is Idle Acres, home of Tadao and Rosamund Wisniewski. Mrs. Wisniewski is the daughter

of the Honorable Mrs. Reginald Fellowes of England, first cousin to the late Winston Churchill.

Acres of lawn give a feeling of space and dignity to this charming old house and its willow-surrounded pond. The striking outdoor sculpture is by Frances Gage, E. B. Cox and Leonard Oesterle. Lemonade will be sold here at the Pool House.

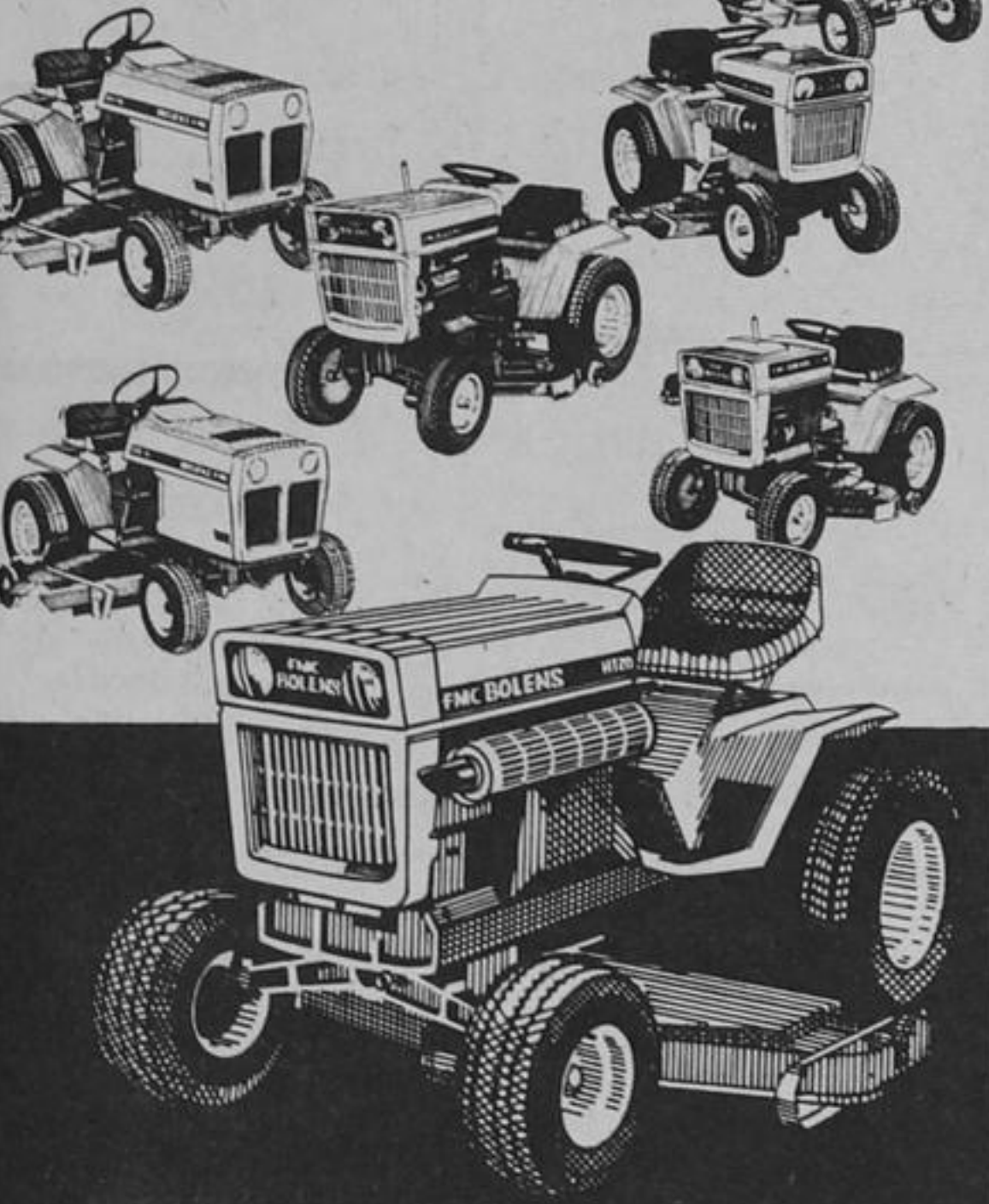
