## Nature Walks This Sunday Seven Conservation Areas

Put on a pair of walking shoes and come out to one of seven Metro Conservation Areas and "Enjoy a walk with a naturalist" Sunday, at 10:30 am and 2:00 pm.

If you're interested in finding out more about the outdoors, this is your opportunity. Experienced naturalists from the Metro Conservation Authority will lead the walks and be on hand to explain the terrain, vegetation and small bird and animal life indigenous to each area.

The walks are scheduled for the following areas—ALBION HILLS CONSERVATION AREA—Five miles north of Bolton on Highway 50.

GLEN HAFY CONSERVATION AREA—South of Mono Mills and Highway 9 on Airport Road.

BOYD CONSERVATION AREA—North of Woodbridge on Islington Avenue North.

BRUCE'S MILL CONSERVATION AREA—Two miles east of Don Mills Road on the Gormley Stoffville Road.

CLAREMONT CONSERVATION AREA—Two miles east of Brougham on Highway 7 and 1/4 miles north on the Westney Road.

COLD CREEK CONSERVATION AREA—Between Bolton and Nobleton, about three miles north of the King sideroad on Concession 11.
