Investigation Fire Injuries

Richmond Hill Fire Department Chief Robert Kennedy has seized two propane gas tanks belonging to Superior Propane Limited, Concord, for investigation, following an explosion Monday night, which sent two men to hospital with second and third degree burns.

In fair condition at York Central Hospital are Leslie Stancowski, 91 Hunt Avenue, and his neighbor, John Saghovio, 61 Hunt Avenue. The two men were injured about 8 pm while soldering pipes in an excavation in front of the Stancowski home.

Apparently a build up of propane gas in the tanks brought about the explosion and flash fire when the soldering torch was lit. The fire also did about \$100 damage to the house, before firefighters got it under control.

An inspector from the Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations was to check the tanks.
