Forest Trip For York Councillors

You probably won't be able to see the forest for regional councillors, August 21. That's the date agreed to by the planning committee headed by Mayor Gladys Rolling of East Gwillimbury for a bus tour of the regional forest — Highway 48 and Davis Drive, for members of council and staff. Purpose of the tour is to see what the forest consists of and to discuss its future. It is part of the activities proposed to celebrate the 50th anniversary of its establishment by the County of York in 1924. A banquet will also be held September 11 for council, invited guests and members of the press. A commemorative bronze plaque will be unveiled before the banquet; the Ministry of Natural Resources will move a large boulder from the edge of the woods to the centre of the lawn at York Forest headquarters; and a ceremony will be conducted for planting of the 5,000,000th tree in the forest. Tours will be conducted for interested groups, and the public will be invited to an Open House on one or more weekends, and also go on a 5-to-10 mile conducted walk, covering six or more forest properties in October when the leaves turn their various colors.

Region Seeks Support Rural Policy

York Regional Planning Committee has approved a recommendation of its committee to seek support from area municipalities, provincial Ministries and other regional agencies, including the county school board, for its interim policy on rural development. The committee gave its approval at a special meeting last week and will now ask regional council to back it

up. The policy is to act as a guideline for both regional and local councils when making commitments to growth to the approximately 50 existing urban settlements along the Yonge Street corridor and on Steeles Avenue. In its report the committee said that, if council took the lead in establishing policies and programs relating to its specific planning responsibilities, it could "effectively influence and direct in a positive way, the location, timing scale and structure of development in the area settlements and municipalities that comprise York Region until the completion of the Official Plan." The policy would assure that no further major development commitments by local municipalities on urban places would be made with-

out substantial contribution from the region. There is now an extensive backlog of formal subdivision proposals in and adjacent to most of the villages and hamlets of the region and, in providing an interim policy, both levels of municipal government could jointly become aware of the broader implications of casual growth in the region's many smaller communities, the report said.
