

#### THE EXPROPRIATIONS ACT

# NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER of an application by the Minister of Transportation and Communications for approval to expropriate lands being in the Town of Markham, in the Town of Vaughan and in the Town of Richmond Hill, in the Regional Municipality of York, in the Province of Ontario, for the purpose of acquiring sufficient land to accommodate the reconstruction of the King's Highway 11 and portions of certain intersecting roads in connection therewith.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described in the schedule hereto.

Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

(i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either per-

sonally or by his counsel or agent, and (ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropria-

"owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:

ting authority to pay such costs forthwith.

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper Land Registry or Sheriff's Office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll;

The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
