Sunday's wind-up between Angus and Windsor was decided in one big inning for the winners. The fourth. All of their four runs happened then. With one man out.

Karen Georgius started it off as the Windsor right-fielder misjudged his fly to right and he ended up on second base. Fitcher Dave Burton then beat out an infield hit. Dave Raycraft then sacrificed both runners along. Ted Bagley then beat out another infield hit with both runners scoring on the play. The final runner rode home on Brother Gerry Raycraft's long blast over the fence in left-center field.

That was the end for Windsor who could do little with the offerings of Burton who chalked up his second straight win in as many games. This time out he allowed six hits in seven innings while striking out four batters. Lefty Don MacFadden tossed and won the other one.

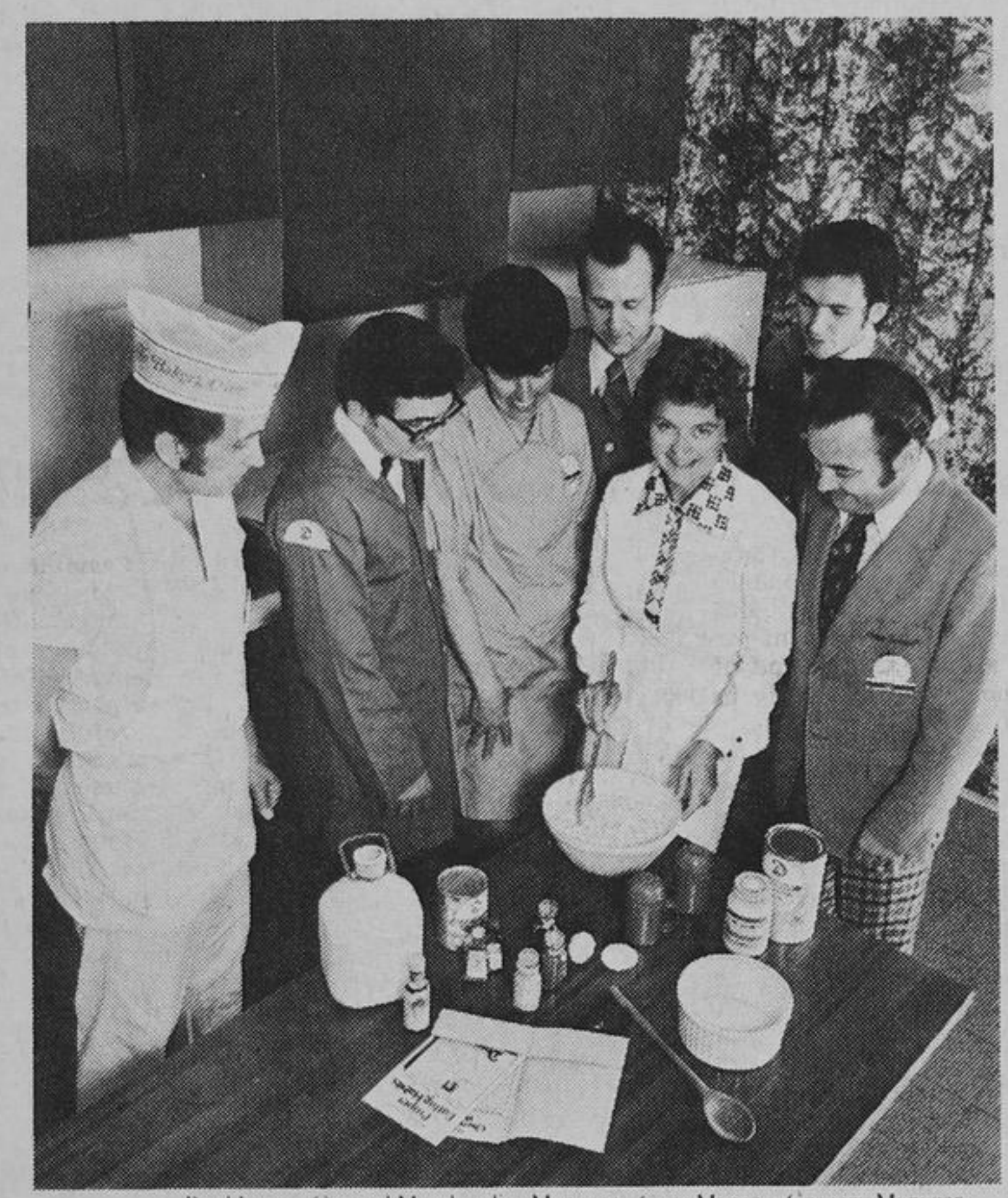
