Water Study Costs Vaughan \$18,000

York Regional Council last week approved a request from Vaughan Town Council for a ground water study in the Boyd Conservation Area. International Water Supply

Limited will be hired to carry
out the exploration for a
well to ensure adequate
water supply to the Woodbridge area.

Cost of the study, which Vaughan will pay via a 10year debenture, is \$\$8,000. Woodbridge is served by

six wells at present, with the capacity of each committed.

The project must still be approved by the Municipal Board.

In Whitchurch-Stouffville, Mayor Gordon Ratcliff said that use of a landfull site in the area by Metro could endanger the town's water supply.

He said the town had requested an environmental hearing on the Highway 48 site, but no reply had been received as yet.

Mayor Ratcliff said the 146-acre site was originally intended for local use, but the dumping of Metro garbage there now was ruining it.

The site is on the Oak Ridges moraine, he said and seepage from large amounts of garbage could affect the water for miles.

"We want it either limited to local use, or discontinued as a landful site," the Mayor




