While On The Road**

Said Mr. Graham: "It has been proven beyond doubt that the use of seat belts significantly reduces death and serious injuries resulting from motor vehicle collisions. For these reasons we have adopted the use of seat belts as part of our regular operating procedure."

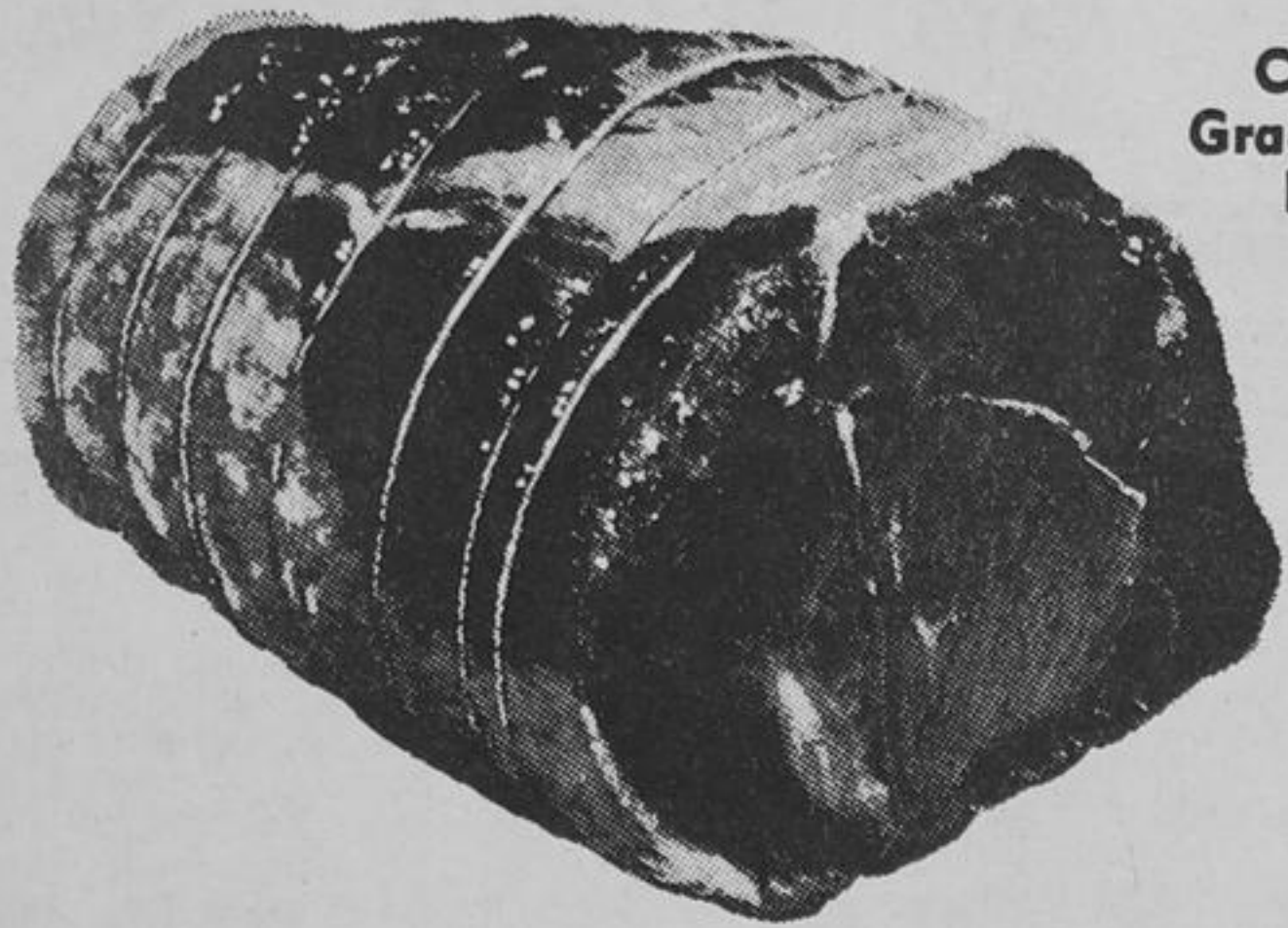
